The Secretary then read the Annual Report of the Committee of Management, also the Financial Statement, for the year ended 31st December, 1875.

The Chairman made a few remarks on the Report read, and moved its adoption, with that of the Balance Sheet, as audited, which was seconded by Mr. Lane, and carried.

THE Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting to the Contributors and Friends of the Institution a Report of their proceedings for the year 1875.

The total number of Patients, &c, who have received aid has been 3,352, viz. :—

The Religion of those admitted during the year has been—

The Financial Statement, duly audited, shows a total receipt,
 from all sources, of £6,418 16s. 4d., with an expenditure for
 maintenance of £6,092 3s. 6d., and of £335 4s 6d. in purchase
 of Government Debentures, leaving a balance on the 31st of
 December of £348 12s. 7d.

The Committee have received the sum of £229 from the
 Hospital Sunday Committee, as proportion of Collections made
 in the various Churches in October last, as well as through the
 Employé's Subscription Lists, which were distributed among
 the various mercantile and other firms, in town and country,
 for Collections on Hospital Saturday.

The hearty thanks of the Management are hereby tendered,
 especially to the Rev. J. D. Robertson and William Upton, Esq.,
 the Honorary Secretary and Treasurer for the same, as well as
 to all those Gentlemen, Clergy and Laity, who took such an
 active part in this movement, which had for its special object
 the pecuniary benefit of the several charities which participated
 in the Collections made on the occasion.

This amount does not include £38 10s. 6d. specially received
 direct from the Ven. Archdeacon Slattery, being Collections
 made in the Roman Catholic Churches in Geelong.

The Committee have gratefully to acknowledge the handsome
 Subscription £50 from Josiah Austin, Esq, of Avaton, Duck
 Ponds, (received through Mr S. V. Buckland.) and have had
 much pleasure in adding his name to the List of Life Governors
 of the Institution.

The following Contributions have also been received during
 the year:—£25 from the Manchester Unity Grand Order of
 Oddfellows, voted at their Lodge Meeting, held in Geelong in

April last ; £20 2s. 10d., being amount collected for a Temperance Hall at Inverleigh, and subsequently voted to this Institution, (received through Mr. McCallum ;) also, Bequests from deceased Patients, viz. :—£13 by James Shirley ; £5 by Michael Quinn ; £5 by James Baldy ; £37 1s 8d. by William Miles.

The Committee very gladly recognise the services of the several Ministers of Religion who hold Divine Worship on the Sundays and week nights for the inmates, and believe that these are appreciated by many

They would also thank the several Ladies, and others, who have visited the Institution. They acknowledge the help of all who have contributed to the amusement and recreation of the sick and infirm, by entertainments, donations of books, papers, flowers, &c.

In reference to the question of the expense of the Medical Staff, which had considerable attention of the Committee in the early part of the year, the Senior Surgeon very generously placed his own salary at their disposal, and arrangements were made whereby Dr. Reid should retain his position, without salary, and expressing their appreciation of his disinterestedness in voluntarily giving up the emoluments of his office for the benefit of the Institution. The salary of Dr. Scott was increased by a £100 a year ; and subsequently, on the death of the head wardman, Quayle, it was thought desirable, on the recommendation of the Medical Officers, to appoint a Resident House Steward, who should be a competent Dispenser, and Mr. Morrison was accordingly selected in the place of Mr. Purdue. By this arrangement, the Secretary resides outside, and is allowed an additional £50 a year, in lieu of board and lodging.

In conclusion, the Committee trust the Institution may continue to prosper under the management of its successors, and be of great service to the destitute sick and suffering, as well as a home for many deserving poor, both of the town and district. Its claims are strongly urged for the continued and increased support of the Subscribers and Public generally.
