THE Committee of Management of the above Institution submit the following Report to the Governors and Subscribers, and append the following particulars.

The number of persons relieved during the year 1881 has been 3411, and they are classified under the following heads :—

With regard to the Financial Statement (duly audited) it will be seen that the total receipts (including balance on hand brought forward) amount to £5922 8s. 9d. Subscriptions and donations—£886 0s. 1d.—though not equal to that collected

in 1879, are in excess of the amount received last year. The Government grant is much less, but this arises partly from the fact that only one instalment (£750) has been received for the year 1881-82; the second instalment has already been applied for, and may be paid shortly, although the total sum allotted by the Government to this institution is not yet known. The proportioned amount of the Hospital Sunday Collections for 1881 has not yet been received.

During the year a considerable amount has been expended in repairs to building and fence, fixing baths and hot water apparatus, &c., in all over £518: the expenditure for maintenance being £4798 3s. 9d., or £456 0s. 3d. less than the previous year.

The amount at credit in bank, &c., is £512 11s. 2d.; liabilities (December accounts) £341 12s. 1d.

The Committee have had under their consideration the revision of the Bye-Laws, and, although little progress has as yet been made, it is expected that such alterations as are deemed necessary may be soon made and carried into effect.

The Regulations have been altered so as to abolish the office of Senior Surgeon, the Subscribers having resolved to dispense with the services of Dr. Reid.

The Committee desire gratefully to acknowledge the true kindness of those who have sent contributions of books and illustrated papers, fish, fruit, poultry, lime, plants, &c., for the benefit of the institution. Especially, also, they beg to refer to the kindness of the ladies of the Flower Mission, whose continued and generous efforts are much appreciated by the patients and inmates. The Committee also desire to express their indebtedness to the Press, for the following newspapers and periodicals (sent for the use of the patients, who highly prize the kindness) viz., *Geelong Advertiser*, *Geelong Times*,

*Argus, Age, Advocate, Ballarat Star, Colac Reformer, Temperance Record, and Southern Cross.*

The meetings of the general and sub committees have been very many during the past year, and the various members have devoted considerable time and attention to the duties necessarily devolving upon them, through circumstances which have arisen in connection with the internal management. The number of meetings held and attendances are given elsewhere.

Dr. Scott, the Resident Surgeon, sent in his resignation in January last year, which was accepted, and Dr. Warren was subsequently elected to the position out of eleven applicants, and commenced his duties on March 1st, when Dr. Scott gave up charge.

Dr. Reid was appointed Senior Surgeon by the Subscribers to the institution, at a special meeting called for that purpose, on March 18th, 1881.

In November last certain grave charges were preferred by Dr. Reid against Dr. Warren, the Resident Surgeon, which were fully investigated at very considerable length by the Committee of Management, who, after due deliberation and careful enquiry, exonerated Dr. Warren from the most serious charges made; and the Committee felt it their duty, under the circumstances, to express their unabated confidence in Dr. Warren and to suspend Dr. Reid, and subsequently submitted the whole matter to the Governors and Subscribers, at a special meeting held at the Town Hall on the 16th December last, when, by a large majority, the action of the Committee was approved of, and Dr. Reid's services were dispensed with.

In December Mr. Neal, Government Inspector of Charities, paid an official visit to the institution, and has recommended many improvements in connection with the internal arrangements, including increased bath and closet accommodation,

especially for the female patients; a better mode for the fumigation of infected clothing; improved drainage; a more effective plan of ventilation in the accident and other wards. He likewise referred to the want of better night nurses than those now employed (viz., the Benevolent Inmates), and recommended separate dining-rooms, if possible, for the Inmates of the Asylum, as being especially necessary to keep the sleeping accommodation cleaner and in better order. The Committee commend these matters, referred to by Mr. Neal, to the serious attention of those who will form the incoming Committee for 1882, and trust that the required improvements may be carried out.

The Committee of Management cannot close their report without referring, with deepest regret, to the losses sustained during the past year in the death of the following members of Committee:—Mr. Brown, Mr. Caldwell, Mr. Johnstone, and Mr. Garratt—the three first mentioned especially, who for so many years were *actively* and *effectively* engaged on the House Committee, and who gave much and most valuable time to the interests of the institution, and whose loss is greatly and deservedly felt.
