# THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

### GEELONG

#### Benevolent Asylum, Entirmary and

#### (Incorporated.)

THE General Committee of Management have the honor to furnish for the information of the Subscribers and the public generally, the 33rd Annual Report of the above Institution, with the Statement of the Receipts and Expenditure for the year ending 31st December, 1884.

During the year 1884 2805 cases have received relief, viz :---

665 In-door Patients.

131 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum. 2009 Out-door Patients.

Of the Hospital Patients,

559 were discharged.

59 died.

47 were under treatment 31st December, 1884.

Of the Benevolent Inmates,

23 were discharged or left of their own accord.

16 died.

92 remained in the House 31st December, 1884.

The daily average in the Institution has been 145.

The average mortality 9.4 per cent.

The total number remaining in the House 31st December, 1884-139.

The receipts for the past year have been £5581 8s. 2d., as compared with £5625 2s. 6d. for the year before.

The expenditure for maintenance has been  $\pounds4790$  0s. 1d., as against  $\pounds4740$  4s. 6d. for 1883.

Private subscriptions and donations are in excess by nearly £200, while proceeds of Concerts, &c., Municipal Grants, Hospital Sunday and Church Collections are less than that received for the previous year.

The following Legacies have been received :— $\pounds 50$  from the late Mr. Charles Ibbotson;  $\pounds 31$  9s. 4d. from Mr. Niel G. Johnson, deceased;  $\pounds 8$  from Mrs. C. McDonald, deceased;  $\pounds 4$  from Mrs. E. Jackson, deceased;  $\pounds 1$  4s. 6d. from M. Morissy, deceased.

The amount sent in from Squatters and others from the country districts is larger this year, and the sincere thanks of the Committee are hereby cordially awarded to these gentlemen for their kind and generous assistance in collecting and forwarding with their own subscriptions the various donations from the shearers and others in their employ.

There have been held during 1884 17 meetings of the General Committee of Management, 56 meetings of the House Committee, 15 meetings of the Finance Committee. The attendances of Members will be found elsewhere.

In October last the Government Inspector of Charities paid his visit to the Institution, and some suggestions made by him are having at present the attention of the Committee, with reference to closet accommodation, ventilation in the wards, appliances to extinguish fire in the event of an outbreak, &c., &c. Capt. Evans, the Inspector, in speaking of the buildings, premises, &c., remarked, "He was fully justified in stating that the buildings inside and out, and everything connected therewith, were clean, and in a most satisfactory condition."

The valued services of the Honorary Medical Staff are gratefully acknowledged, especially those of Dr. Reid and Dr. Croker, whose cordial and continued assistance at all times given is most thankfully recognised by the Committee, who desire also to express their indebtedness to the press for the gratuitous copies of their daily papers kindly sent for the use of the inmates.

The sincere thanks of the Committee are likewise given to the Ministers of Religion of various denominations and others who have held services and given instruction from time to time to the patients, as also to the ladies of the Flower Mission and others who have contributed donations in money and kind for the use of the inmates.

## An ACT for HOSPITALS and CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

(2ND JUNE, 1864.)

ACT OF THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA, No. 220.

The Sections only of the Act which are of present practical importance are here cited. Of the remaining Sections, 1, 2, and 3 relate to the Mode of Incorporation; Sections 5 and 6 to the First Meeting after Incorporation; Section 10 to the Transfer of existing Trust Property to the New Corporation; Section 16 repeals pro tanto former Acts.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the good government of hospitals and other charitable institutions. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

4. Every such incorporated institution\* as aforesaid shall be governed by a committee of not less than seven members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being to such institution; and such committee or any four of them shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities by this Act vested in the corporation; and one-fourth part of such committee or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of such institution; and the president, vice-presidents and treasurer of every such institution shall by virtue of their respective offices be members of such committee.

7. It shall be competent for the corporation of any such institution to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections and for conducting such elections, and generally for all matters whatscever affecting the management of the institution not inconsistent with the laws of this colony; but no such bye-laws shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose and published in the *Government Gazette*. Provided that no such bye-laws shall enable any contributor to exercise more than three votes.

8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke any such bye-law; and every order by which any such bye-law shall be revoked shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect from the time of such publication.

<sup>\*</sup> i.e. Every institution incorporated under Sections 1, 2, 3 of this Act. The Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum was incorporated by Order in Council, dated 11th March, 1872, under the style and title of "The Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum."

9. If any contributor to the support of any such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall desire to dispute the validity of any such bye-law, and shall pay into the Supreme Court the sum of fifteen pounds as security for the costs of the proceedings hereinafter meutioned, it shall be hawful for such contributor to apply to the said court upon an affidavit of the facts for a rule calling upon the corporation to show cause why such byc-law should not be quashed for the illegality thereof; and the said court may make the same absolute, or discharge it with or without payment of costs as to the court shall seem meet.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election. or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

12. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant; and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.

13. All notices to any officer or member of or contributor to any present or future charitable institution whether incorporated or not, which by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) of such institution for the time being are or shall be required to be given, may be served by the same being transmitted through the post directed according to an address in this colony (to be left; for that purpose by such officer, member or contributor in writing under his hand at the chief establishment of such institution) in such time as to admit of their delivery in the due course of post at or before such period (if any) as is or shall be prescribed by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) for the time being of such institution for the giving of such notices.

14. In proving such service as aforesaid it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was so directed as aforesaid, and put into a general post office in such time as aforesaid; but so nevertheless that nothing in this Act contained shall be held to render invalid any personal service of any notice, or to render necessary to the effectual service of any notice any further act, matter or thing than would have been required for the service thereof by the charter, statutes, laws, or rules for the time being of the institution which the same shall concern if this Act had not been passed.

15. No notice of any intended court, board meeting or election shall be required to be served either by post or otherwise on any officer or member of or contributor to any such institution as last aforesaid who shall not have left an address in the manner at the place and for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, anything in any such charter, statutes, laws or rules to the contrary notwithstanding.

# BYE-LAWS.

The following are the BYE-LAWS of THE GEELONG INFIRMARY AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM, (Incorporated,) made by the Contributors thereof, on the 11th day of April, 1883, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on the 20th day of April in same year, and \*

#### BYE-LAWS.

1. All Bye-Laws made prior to the date of making these Bye-Bye-Laws. Laws are hereby repealed, provided always that any regulations made or agreements entered into under Bye-Laws now in force shall be taken to have been made under these Bye-Laws, until the same is amended or rescinded.

#### OBJECTS.

2. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and Objects of Instisurgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of tution. paying patients whose admission under special circumstances may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

#### APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

3. That a portion of the buildings shall be set apart for the Appropriation of purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Buildings. Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatics, on remand for medical examination, in a ward erected for that purpose.

#### CONSTITUTION.

4. The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presi- Constitution. dents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

- 7. Recommendations shall be made by ticket, and shall be only used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions; but in cases where the payment is made after the 31st of July in any year, the Subscriber shall have the option of taking tickets for that or the following year. Tickets shall only be available till the 31st January in the year after that for which issued. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*, one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients.
- Annual Subscribers. 8. Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed annual subscribers from date of payment.
- Number of Votes 9. At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes; £3 3s., two votes; £1, one vote.
- Limitation of Voting.
  - 10. No person shall vote or take part in any Meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Institution.
- Notices of Meetings.

11. Notices of all General and Special Meetings shall be sent (by post) by the Secretary to such Contributors as shall leave their address for that purpose in writing under their hands at the Institution.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

ANNUAL MEETINGS. 12. An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year for the following purposes :---

- (1) To receive the report of the Committee of Management for the preceding year, and audited statements of receipts and expenditure.
- (2) For the election of President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors, for the ensuing year.

- (3) The election of Members of the Committee of Management to fill vacancies.
- (4) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting connected with the Institution.

13. If required by the Committee of Management, or upon the Special Meetings. requisition in writing of six members of the Committee or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

14. All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary Meetings to be called by adby advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, vertisement. for at least one week previous to such meeting.

15. At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his Chairman Meetings. absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall take the chair ; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

16. Ten contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum Quorum. at all meetings of Contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-anhour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

17. Every question submitted to a General Meeting, and all Mode of Voting. elections, shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors present entitled to vote, and shall be taken by show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote; in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken.

#### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

The Institution shall be governed by a Committee, each of Constitution 18. whom shall be a subscriber of not less than £1 per annum, and shall consist of the President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eighteen Governors or Contributors. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution may be members of the Committee. Four members of Committee (but not including more than one of the honorary staff) shall form a quorum.

19. The names of candidates for any offices shall be advertised in Names of Candione or more newspapers published in Geelong three clear days before the date of meeting for election. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting unless he or some one duly authorised on his behalf shall have given notice in writing to the Secretary at least four days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to become a candidate for one or more of the annual offices, but no person shall hold more than one office whereby a seat at the Board may be vacated. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of,

20. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors, shall retire annually from their respective offices at the annual meeting of Contributors, but nevertheless be eligible for re-election; and in the event of the annual election to fill vacancies from any cause not taking place on the day appointed, they shall hold office until the elections take place.

Whenever any vacancy shall occur in the office of President. cancies of Pres- the Committee shall appoint one of the Vice-Presidents to fill the same; and if any vacancy shall occur in the office of Vice-President, the Committee shall elect one of their number to the office until the next annual meeting.

> The Committee shall meet at the Institution on the second 22Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may Special meetings appoint for the transaction of general business. may be convened by order of the President, or upon the request in writing of four members of the Committee. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each member by the Secretary at least twenty-four hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be considered.

> The President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, 23. shall preside; if they also be absent the Committee shall elect its own Chairman. The Chairman shall have a casting, but not a deliberate vote. If a quorum be not present on any monthly meeting within twenty minutes of the time fixed, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

> 24. No member of the Committee of Management, nor officer of the Institution, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly; but this shall not apply to any member of a company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association ; but no member of the Committee of Management shall be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he shall, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

> 25. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the Institution, and frame regulations for its internal management (such regulations not to be repugnant to the Hospital Statute and Bye-laws); they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution; and enter into all necessary contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles; and for the repair, alteration, and extension of buildings; they shall direct the collection of the funds, and make all necessary payments in connection with the Institution. They shall superintend or give instructions, and make regulations for the admission, discharge, or dismissal of patients and inmates, in accordance with the objects of the Institution and Bye-Laws.

26. The Committee of Management shall, at its first meeting in to be appointed, each year, after the annual meeting of Subscribers, choose from among themselves two Sub-Committees, each to be composed of five members-three to form a quorum; one to be designated the House Committee, and the other the Finance Committee, and, when practicable, two or more members of an old may be members of a new Committee. The Committee of Management may also at any time appoint Sub-Committees for any purpose connected with the Institution or its management, and may fix and alter the quorum of, and continue, alter, or discontinue such Committees. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be ex officio members of all Committees, and the Treasurer shall be ex officio member of the Finance Committee.

27. The House, Finance, or other Sub-Committee shall Meetings of Sub-appoint their own Chairman, and meet as directed by the Bye-Laws, Committees. or as they may determine, and whenever convened by order of the Minutes of their proceedings shall be recorded in a book, Chairman. and be read to the Committee of Management at each monthly meeting.

The House Committee shall meet once at the least in each Duties & powers 28.week, and oftener if necessary. They shall have power, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals of their meetings; they shall examine into and report to the General Committee upon all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the Institution, recording in their minutes reasons for the non-admission or for dismissal; they may engage and discharge servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly tenders, and recommend any to the General Committee for acceptance; they shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally; they, or some of their number, shall weekly inspect the wards, kitchen, and other portions of the Institution; they shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Finance Committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

The Finance Committee shall meet at least twice in each Duties & powers 29. month, and shall examine the Secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with Treasurer's bank pass-book; they shall also compare the Collector's books, and receipt butts with advertised list of subscriptions and donations, check additions, and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the Treasurer; they shall give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collector with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of subscriptions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the Committee of Management at their monthly meetings, and shall in conjunction with the President, or a Vice-President and Secretary, be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; they shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted; and shall also examine the returns prepared for Government, and annual statements of accounts.

30. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Verifying Books House or Finance Committee, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended, with the date of examination.

31. At the monthly meetings of Committee of Management, Business at Comthe minutes of the previous monthly meeting, and of special mittee Meetings meetings during the month, shall be read and confirmed, no discussion being allowed thereon except as to their accuracy; the minutes Minutes. and reports of all Sub-Committees shall also be read, and on all questions votes shall be taken by show of hands, each member Voting. having one vote only. > The Committee of Management may suspend any honorary 82 medical officer, or one or more of its own members, on any wellfounded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, and provided that the suspension and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of Contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose within two weeks after the order of suspension is made; and the House Committee may suspend any paid officer of the Institution, and make arrangements for the performance of the duties by other officer or person, provided the suspension be reported to the Committee of Management, and a meeting of such Committee be specially convened for the consideration thereof within one week of such suspension. But in any case of intention to suspend, the person proposed to be suspended shall have immediate notice in writing of such intention, and the reasons or causes for such, and shall have the privilege to claim and have as is enstomary a Board of Enquiry appointed to hear, consider and record his or her defence, and have witnesses examined for or against him or her.

33. The Committee of Management shall have power to invest in Government Debentures, contributions specially given for the purpose of endowment, or any bequests which in the interests of the Institution they consider should be capitalised.

The Committee of Management shall present a general Annual Report 34. The Committee of Ansatzener with the duly and ted and Balance report of the affairs of the Institution, together with the duly and ited balance sheet, at the annual meeting of Governors and Contributors, in January of each year, such balance sheet to be published once in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

> 35. No regulation or alteration of any regulation made by the Committee of Management shall be valid (although ad interim the same may be enforced) unless confirmed at the next subsequent monthly meeting of the Committee to that at which it was decided on; and no resolution passed by the Committee shall be reseinded within three months unless one month's notice respecting same shall be first given. Any regulation may be considered and altered. by the Contributors at the annual meeting in January, or at a Special Meeting.

# COMMON SEAL.

COMMON SEAL. 36. The common seal of the Corporation shall be kept in the iron chest at the Hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys Custody. -one of which shall be kept by the President, and the other by the Secretary.

37. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other Authority to affix instrument except by order of the Committee of Management.

38. All monies received on account of the Institution shall be paid to the Treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to Receipt of Money the credit of the Institution in such Bank as the Committee may from time to time appoint,

39. Upon receipt of any monies from the Secretary or Collector, Acquittance. the Treasurer shall sign a book, to be kept for the purpose by each, for the amount so paid.

All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be Payments. 40. signed by the President or a Vice-President, the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary.

Previous to signing any cheque for payment, the Treasurer Anthority 41. for payments. shall require a warrant, signed by the President or Chairman of the Meeting of Committee of Management, at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the Secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with Bye-Law No. 28-such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the Committee.

42. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Treasurer, the Vacancy. Committee of Management may appoint another to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

# THE SECRETARY AND SUPERINTENDENT.

43. He shall attend all general and special meetings of Contributors, and all meetings of the General and Sub-Committees, and Duties of Secretake minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the Institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, giving proper notice thereof, and bring the business before the same, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committee.

44. He shall be responsible for the conduct of the clerical Keep Accounts. business of his department, and shall keep the necessary books of account, under the directions of the finance Committee; and at each monthly meeting of the Committee of Management he shall submit the cash-book and bank pass-book of the Institution, make up to date; and he shall also submit a list of subscriptions and a monthly progress balance sheet in the prescribed form, showing the actual position of the Hospital funds to the end of the previous month.

45. He shall compile all needful returns, statements, and reports Prepare returns required by Government and any of the Committees, and shall in every year make application by circular or otherwise to corporate bodies, societies, squatters, and country residents, for contributions to the funds of the Institution.

46. He shall not in any way be engaged in private business; Responsibility as and under the direction of the Committee he shall, as Superintendent. be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the Institution, excepting those relating to the Medical and Surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

47. He shall give security for his faithfulness in all matters of Give Security. finance for the sum of £250, of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management.

He shall have power to suspend any warder or nurse, (after Suspension 48. consultation with the Resident Surgeon, who shall have equal power as to Warders and Nurses.) He shall also have power to suspend any other servant of the Institution, such suspension to be reported to the House Committee at their next meeting, and if necessary arrangements be made for the performance of the duties in the interim.

Two Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting of 49. Governors and Contributors, in January in each year, and the remuneration to them, if any, shall then be fixed. In default of such appointment, or in the event of any vacancy occurring during the year. the Committee of Management shall make the appointment.

Access to Books at all times.

50. They shall have access to all the books and accounts of the Institution at any time to check the same; and shall report to the Committee of Management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring to notice.

Annual Audit.

51. They shall in the first week in January in each year examine the Treasurer's Annual Financial Statement, with all books, accounts and documents relating thereto, and List of Subscriptions and Donations, and shall certify to their correctness, and make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the Annual Meeting.

The Collector shall, under the direction of the Finance 52. Committee and Secretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to To give Receipts, the funds of the Institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which Farnish Tickets shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee. He shall furnish to Contributors, from whom he receives a subscription of £1 and upwards, the admission tickets (signed by the Secretary) to which they are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the Annual Report of the preceding year. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least Keep duplicate in every week he shall copy all entries into a duplicate book to be kept at the Institution. He shall pay over to the Treasurer, once in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all monies received Pay to Treasurer by him, and shall furnish to the Treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the Treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.

> 53. The books used by the Collector shall be provided by the Committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the Institution; and the Collector shall at any time upon demand deliver up his books and butts for examination or retention. He shall, when required, be in attendance at the meetings of the Finance Committee. and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give security for the faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of £150 of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management. He shall be paid monthly, in such manner as the Committee shall determine, and shall be liable to be removed from office at any time without notice.

# HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The Honorary Medical Staff shall be elected by the Gover-54. nors and Contributors at the annual meeting in January of each year; and the number to be elected shall be decided by such meeting, but shall not exceed four; and should a vacancy occur during the year, then the power of filling the same shall rest with the General Committee of Management.

55. No person shall be eligible for election as an Honorary Qualification. Physician or an Honorary Surgeon unless he shall be registered as a legally-qualified medical practitioner under any Act in force in Victoria relating to medical practitioners, and unless he shall possess (for the office of physician) a degree from some one of the Universities of the United Kingdom, or of the Australian Colonies, or a Foreign University recognised by them, or a Diploma from a College of Physicians in the United Kingdom ; and unless he shall possess (for the office of Surgeon) a degree as Master of Surgerv from some one of the aforesaid Universities, or be a member or Licentiate of some one College of Surgeons in the United Kingdom.

56. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects comply with the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Institution.

57. No one shall be present at the time of any operation or Surgical Operpost mortem examination except such persons as may be connected ations. with the Institution, or members of the medical profession.

# ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

58. Accidents, and such cases of decided emergency only, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed, may be Infirmary. admission of patients, in ordinary cases, recommended by Subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of NINE and TWELVE o'Clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon ; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

### ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the Admission 59. House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able in the estimation of the Committee to pay, shall be required to do so at such a rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall General Rules to be observed. be applicable to and be observed by all paying patients.

### PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

61. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no Persons not ad-insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunatic Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in case of accilent or for a surgical operation ; nor, except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals

63. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber.

In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice, or to support himself or herself elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged as in-patients of the Infirmary or Benevolent Asylum. at the rate of ten shillings per diem from date of admission ; or, if an out-patient, ten shillings for each occasion on which either of the Surgeons may have been consulted ; and the Committee may order. the removal of such person from the Institution, provided the case is not one of emergency.

# RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

65. Ministers of religion shall have free access to persons of sters of Retheir respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

# AN ACT FOR HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

# (2ND JUNE, 1864.)

ACT OF THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA, No. 220.

The Sections only of the Act which are of present practical importance are here cited. Of the remaining Sections, 1, 2, and 3 relate to the Mode of Incorporation; Sections 5 and 6 to the First Meeting after Incorporation; Section 10 to the Transfer of existing Trust Property to the New Corporation; Section 16 repeals pro tanto former Acts.

W HEREAS it is expedient to provide for the good government of hospitals and other charitable institutions. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

4. Every such incorporated institution\* as aforesaid shall be governed by a committee of not less than seven members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being to such institution; and such committee or any four of them shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities by this Act vested in the corporation; and one fourth part of such committee or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of such institution; and the president, vice-presidents and treasurer of every such institution shall by virtue of their respective offices be members of such committee.

7. It shall be competent for the corporation of any such institution to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections and for conducting such elections, and generally for all matters whatscover affecting the management of the institution not inconsistent with the laws of this colony; but no such bye-laws shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose and published in the *Government Gazette*. Provided that no such bye-laws shall enable any contributor to exercise more than three votes.

8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke any such byelaw; and every order by which any such bye-law shall be revoked shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect from the time of such publication.

<sup>\*</sup> i.e. Every institution incorporated under Sections 1, 2, 3 of this Act. The Geolong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum was incorporated by Order. in <u>Council</u>, dated 11th <u>March</u>, 1872, under the style and title of "The Geolong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum."

9. If any contributor to the support of any such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall desire to dispute the validity of any such bye-law, and shall pay into the Supreme Court the sum of fifteen pounds as security for the costs of the proceedings hereinafter mentioned, it shall be lawful for such contributor to apply to the said court upon an affidavit of the facts for a rule calling upon the corporation to show cause why such bye-law should not be quashed for the illegality thereof; and the said court may make the same absolute, or discharge it with or without payment of costs as to the court shall seem meet.

11. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

12. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant; and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the élection of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.

13. All notices to any officer or member of or contributor to any present or future charitable institution whether incorporated or not, which by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) of such institution for the time being are or shall be required to be given, may be served by the same being transmitted through the post directed according to an address in this colony (to be left for that purpose by such officer, member or contributor in writing under his hand at the chief establishment of such institution) in such time as to admit of their delivery in the due course of post at or before such period (if any) as is or shall be prescribed by the charter statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) for the time being of such institution for the giving of such notices.

14. In proving such service as aforesaid it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was so directed as aforesaid, and put into a general post office in such time as aforesaid; but so nevertheless that nothing in this Act contained shall be held to render invalid any personal service of any notice, or to render necessary to the effectual service of any notice any further act, matter or thing than would have been required for the service thereof by the charter, statutes, laws or rules for the time being of the institution which the same shall concern if this Act had not been passed.

15. No notice of any intended court, board meeting or election shall be required to be served either by post or otherwise on any officer or member of or contributor to any such institution as last aforesaid who shall not have left an address in the manner at the place and for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, anything in any such charter, statutes, laws or rules to the contrary notwithstanding.

1. All Bye-Laws made prior to the date of making these Bye- Bye-Laws. Laws are hereby repealed, provided always that any regulations made or agreements entered into under Bye-Laws now in force shall be taken to have been made under these Bye-Laws, until the same is amended or rescinded.

### OBJECTS.

2. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and Objects of Instisurgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of tution. paying patients whose admission under special circumstances may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

# APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

3. That a portion of the buildings shall be set apart for the Appropriation of purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Buildings. Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatics, on remand for medical examination, in a ward crected for that purpose.

### CONSTITUTION.

Tickets of Admission. 7. Recommendations shall be made by ticket, and shall be only used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions; but in cases where the payment is made after the 31st of July in any year, the subscriber shall have the option of taking tickets for that or the following year. Tickets shall only be available till the 31st January in the year after that for which issued. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients'.

8. Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed annual subscribers from date of payment.

9. At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 55. and upwards three votes; £8 85, two votes; £1, one vote.

of 10. No person shall vote or take part in any Meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Institution.

11. Notices of all General and Special Meetings shall be sent (by post) by the Secretary to such Contributors as shall leave their address for that purpose in writing under their hands at the Institution.

# GENERAL MEETINGS.

12. An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year for the following purposes :---

- (1) To receive the report of the Committee of Management for the preceding year, and audited statements of receipts and expenditure.
- (2) For the election of President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors, for the ensuing year.

If required by the Committee of Management, or upon the Special Meetings, requisition in writing of six members of the Committee or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

14. All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary Meetings to be by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong. for at least one week previous to such meeting.

15. At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his Chairman absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall take the chair ; but in their Meetings. absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

Ten contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum Quorum. 16. at all meetings of Contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

17. Every question submitted to a General Meeting, and all Mode of Vtoing. elections, shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors *present* entitled to vote, and shall be taken by show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote; in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken.

# COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

The Institution shall be governed by a Committee, each of Constitution 18. whom shall be a subscriber of not less than 41 per annunn, and shall consist of the President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eighteen Governors or Contributors. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution may be members of the Committee. Four members of Committee (but not including more than one of the honorary staff) shall form a quorum.

The names of candidates for any offices shall be advertised in Names of Candione or more newspapers published in Geelong, three clear days before the date of meeting for election. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting, unless he or some one duly authorised on his behalf shall have given notice in writing to the Secretary at least four days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to become a candidate for one or more of the annual offices, but no person shall hold more than one office whereby a seat at the Board may be vacated. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of,

No member of the Committee of Management, nor officer of the Institution, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly; but this shall not apply to any member of a company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association ; but no member of the Committee of Management shall be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he shall. by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

25. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the Institution, and frame regulations for its internal management (such regulations not to be repugnant to the Hospital Statute and Bye-laws); they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution; and enter into all necessary contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles; and for the repair, alteration, and extension of buildings ; they shall direct the collection of the funds, and make all necessary payments in connection with the Institution. They shall superintend or give instructions, and make regulations for the admission, discharge, or dismissal of patients and inmates, in accordance with the objects of the Institution and Bye-Laws.

26. year the Committee shall consider and determine the rate of salaries and wages of the officers and servants of the Institution for the ensuing year; and should vacancies occur, or by giving three months' Fix Salaries, &c. notice, they shall have power to alter or amend rates of salaries and wages then determined upon.

> The Committee of Management may suspend any honorary 32. medical officer, or one or more of its own members, on any wellfounded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, and provided that the suspension and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of Contributors. to be specially convened for that purpose within two weeks after the order of suspension is made; and the House Committee may suspend any paid officer of the Institution, and make arrangements for the performance of the duties by other officer or person, provided the suspension be reported to the Committee of Management, and a meeting of such Committee be specially convened for the consideration thereof within one week of such suspension. But in any case of intention to suspend, the person proposed to be suspended shall have immediate notice in writing of such intention, and the reasons or causes for such, and shall have the privilege to claim and have as is customary a Board of Enquiry appointed to hear, consider and record his or her defence, and have witnesses examined for or against him or her.

33. The Committee of Management shall have power to invest in Government Debentures, contributions specially given for the purpose of endowment, or any bequests which in the interests of the Institution they consider should be capitalised.

The Committee of Management shall present a general **34**. and Balance report of the affairs of the Institution, together with a duly audited balance sheet, at the annual meeting of Governors and Contributors, in January of each year, such balance sheet to be published once in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

35. No regulation or alteration of any regulation made by the Committee of Management shall be valid (although ad interim the same may be enforced) unless confirmed at the next subsequent monthly meeting of the Committee to that at which it was decided on; and no resolution passed by the Committee shall be rescinded within three months unless one month's notice respecting same shall be first given. Any regulation may be considered and altered by the Contributors at the annual meeting in January, or at a Special Meeting.

38. All monies received on account of the Institution shall be paid to the Treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to the Receipt of money oredit of the Institution, in such Bank as the Committee may from time to time appoint.

Upon receipt of any monies from the Secretary or Collector, Acquittance. **89**. the Treasurer shall sign a book, to be kept for the purpose by each. for the amount so paid.

40. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be Payments. signed by the President or a Vice-President, the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary.

41. Previous to signing any cheque for payment the Treasurer Authority shall require a warrant, signed by the President or Chairman of the payments. Meeting of Committee of Management at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the Secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with Bye-Law No. 28-such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the Committee.

42. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Treasurer, the Vacancy. Committee of Management may appoint another to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

### THE SECRETARY AND SUPERINTENDENT.

43. He shall attend all general and special meetings of Contributors, and all meetings of the General and Sub-Committees, and Duties of Secretake minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the Institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, giving proper notice thereof, and bring the business before the same, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committee.

44. He shall be responsible for the conduct of the clerical Keep Accounts. business of his department, and shall keep the necessary books of account, under the directions of the Finance Committee; and at each monthly meeting of the Committee of Management he shall submit the cash-book and bank pass-book of the Institution, make up to date; and he shall also submit a list of subscriptions and a monthly progress balance sheet in the prescribed form, showing the actual position of the Hospital funds to the end of the previous month.

45. He shall compile all needful returns, statements, and reports Prepare returns required by Government and any of the Committees, and shall in every year make application by circular or otherwise, to corporate bodies, societies, squatters, and country residents, for contributions to the funds of the Institution.

46. He shall not in any way be engaged in private business; Responsibility as and under the direction of the Committee he shall, as Superintendent, be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the Institution, excepting those relating to the Medical and Surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

He shall give security for his faithfulness in all matters of Give Security. 47. finance for the sum of ±250, of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management.

He shall have power to suspend any warder or nurse, (after Suspension 48. consultation with the Resident Surgeon, who shall have equal power Servants. as to Warders and Nurses.) He shall also have power to suspend any other Servant of the Institution, such suspension to be reported to the House Committee at their next meeting, and if necessary arrangements be made for the performance of the duties in the interim.

# AUDITORS.

Two Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting of 49. Governors and Contributors in January in each year, and the remuneration to them, if any, shall then be fixed. In default of such appointment, or in the event of any vacancy occurring during the year. the Committee of Management shall make the appointment.

They shall have access to all the books and accounts of the 50. Institution at any time, to check the same; and shall report to the Committee of Management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring to notice.

52. The Collector shall, under the direction of the Finance Committee and Secretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the Institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee. He shall furnish to Contributors from whom he receives a subscription of £1 and upwards the admission tickets (signed by the Secretary) to which they are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the Annual Report of the preceding year. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week he shall copy all entries into a duplicate book to be kept at the Institution. He shall pay over to the Treasurer, once in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all monies received Pay to Treasurer by him, and shall furnish to the Treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the Treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.

The books used by the Collector shall be provided by the 58. -Committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the Institution -and the Collector shall at any time upon demand, deliver up his books and butts for examination or retention. He shall, when re-Attendance when quired, be in attendance at the meetings of the Finance Committee. and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give security for the faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of £150 of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management. He shall be paid monthly, manner as the such Committee shall determine. and shall be liable to be removed from office at any time without notice.

# HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

HONORARY 54. The Honorary Medical Staff shall be elected by the Gover-STAFF nors and Contributors at the annual meeting in January of each year; Election, and the number to be elected shall be decided by such meeting, but shall not exceed four; and should a vacancy occur during the year, then the power of filling the same shall rest with the General Committee of Management.

55. No person shall be eligible for election as an Honorary Qualification. Physician or an Honorary Surgeon unless he shall be registered as a legally-qualified medical practitioner under any Act in force in Victoria relating to medical practitioners, and unless he shall possess (for the office of physician) a degree from some one of the Universities of the United Kingdom, or of the Australian Colonies, or a Foreign University recognised by them, or a Diploma from a College of Physicians in the United Kingdom; and unless he shall possess (for the office of Surgeon) a degree as Master of Surgery from some one of the aforesaid Universities, or be a member or Licentiate of some one College of Surgeons in the United Kingdom.

56. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects comply with the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Institution.

### SURGICAL OPERATIONS. &c.

No one shall be present at the time of any operation or Surgical 57. Operpost mortem examination, except such persons as may be connected ations. with the Institution, or members of the medical profession.

### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

58. Accidents, and such cases of decided emergency only, as in Admission into the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed, may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket; and the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, recommended by Subscribers tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of NINE and TWELVE O'Clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

### ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

Paving patients may be admitted at the discretion of the Admission 59. House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefor, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able in the estimation of the Committee to pay, shall be required to do so at such a rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall General Rules to be observed. be applicable to and be observed by all paying patients.

## PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

61. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no Persons not adinsane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunatic Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy: nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in case of accident or for a surgical operation ; nor, except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals

Provided that the House Committee or Officers of the exist. Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

# ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall 62.nevolent Asy- be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement ; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

### OUT-PATIENTS.

63. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber.

### IMPOSTORS.

64. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice, or to support himself or herself elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged as in-patients of the Infirmary or Benevolent Asylum, at the rate of ten shillings per diem from date of admission ; or, if an out-patient, ten shillings for each occasion on which either of the Surgeons may have been consulted; and the Committee may order the removal of such person from the Institution, provided the case is not one of emergency.

### RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

Ministers of religion shall have free access to persons of 65. their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

That the instruction of the patients in the Institution be In-66. left to the recognised religious teachers of the various denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.

#### REGULATIONS.

67. Copies of all Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the Officers, officers or servants of the Institution, shall be furnished to them by and posted in the Secretary; and with respect to the patients and visitors the regulations affecting them shall be hung up in each ward of the Institution.

### BYE-LAWS.

68. Any alterations, amendments, or additions proposed to be made in the Bye-Laws, shall be advertised once in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, at least seven days before the meeting at which the same are to be considered.
