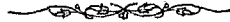

THE FORTIETH ANNUAL REPORT.

THE GENERAL COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT has the honor to submit the following Report to the Governors and Contributors to the Institution, for the year ended 30th June, 1892.

During the last twelve months 2335 cases have received relief, viz:—

648 Indoor Patients.  
 155 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum.  
 1537 Outdoor Patients.

Hospital Cases:

521 Discharged, cured or relieved.  
 65 Died.  
 57 Remaining, 30th June, 1892.

Benevolent Asylum Inmates:

24 Discharged, or left at their own request.

 105 Remaining, 30th June, 1892.

daily average in the House has been 159·3.

The average rate of mortality has been 11·4 per cent. for all cases and 10·1 for Hospital Indoor Patients. Of the Hospital cases 11 proved fatal within 48 hours after admission, and deducting these the death rate for Indoor Patients would be 8·4. This compares very favorably with the death rate of other Institutions, and speaks well for the management of yours notwithstanding the many defects of the buildings.

The total number remaining in the House on the 30th June, 1892, was 162.

According to the Financial Statement (duly audited) the total receipts for maintenance purposes were £6280 19s. 6d., including legacies under £50, and the sum of £394 10s. borrowed from the Endowment Fund.

Total Expenditure, £6450 10s. 10d. for maintenance, repairs to buildings, etc.

The Bank Overdraft on June 30th, 1892, was £242 7s. 1d., and thus the year's Expenditure for general purposes is £564 1s. 4d. in excess of the receipts.

The amount to the credit of the Endowment Fund at the commencement of the present financial year was £8500 3s. 9d. Of this amount £6926 13s. was on Deposit in the Bank of Australasia, or invested in Government Securities, and the remaining £1573 10s. 9d. had been advanced by way of Loan to the General Maintenance Account prior to June 30th, 1891.

A separate account has been opened at the Bank of Australasia this year called the Endowment Fund Account; and to the credit of this account, the amount of £1323 1s. 10d. has been paid—this sum having come to the Institution in the shape of legacies. Of this £1323 1s. 10d., there has been advanced as Loan to the General Account the sum of £394 10s.

The Endowment Fund has therefore to its credit on June 30th, 1892, £9823 5s. 7d. (cash £7855 4s. 10d, loans to General Account, £1968 0s. 9d.)

To the Ministering Children's League and its indefatigable Honorary Secretary, Mrs Howard Hitchcock, the thanks of your Committee are tendered for the very pretty and useful Child's Cot and fittings, which has been a source of comfort and enjoyment to many a sick little one during the past year."

Your Committee has much pleasure in stating that during the past year the funds of the Institution were augmented on two occasions by means of Entertainments, etc., promoted by friends of the Hospital and publicly held in the town. The first was in the form of a Bazaar held at the Priory, Newtown, by permission of the late Misses Dawson, which realized about £40; and the second was a Cantata given at the Mechanics' Institute by the Pupils of the Ashby State School under the conductorship of the Head Master, Mr G. H. Carter, which resulted in a nett gain of about £15 to the funds of the Institution.

Your Committee, whilst thanking the friends who contributed to make these Entertainments so successful in the past year, would feel grateful to other friends who can see their way to rendering help to the sick and poor in the Hospital in the year now entered upon through similar channels.

During the past year the Staff of the Hospital has undergone several changes. In September 1891, the Matron Miss Stitt, and the House Steward and Dispenser, Mr W. A. London, sent in their resignations to your Committee, and they were accepted.

After careful selection from a large number of candidates, your Committee appointed as Matron, Mrs C. Denham, who had for four years held the position of Matron at the Stockwell Fever and Small-pox Hospital, near London; and in addition had held other responsible positions. Mrs Denham, besides being thoroughly experienced in the general duties of a Matron is also a trained nurse, having qualified at St. Thomas's Hospital, London.

Your Committee has pleasure in stating that since her appointment, Mrs Denham has fully borne out her reputation and has thoroughly re-organised the department of which she is head.

special donations in money or kind enabled the management to make the Christmas and New Year's seasons times of special enjoyment to the inmates; and those Ladies and Gentlemen who have from time to time sent gifts of illustrated papers, periodicals, etc., all of which are much appreciated.

The thanks of the Committee are again tendered to the Honorary Medical Staff for their valued services; also to the Proprietors of the newspapers who continue to forward gratis copies of their respective papers for the use of the Institution.

A number of Concerts and Entertainments have been given to the Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum during the year under review, which have been much appreciated by the old people, whose opportunities for such enjoyment are but few. Your Committee has much pleasure in acknowledging the services rendered in this way by the members of the Christ Church Union, Geelong Mutual Improvement Society, and Chilwell Literary Society, and also by many other ladies and gentlemen.

There have been no resignations on the part of members of your Committee; but the Rev. J. W. Crisp and Dr. Small forfeited their seats through non-attendance, and were subsequently re-elected by the Committee. They now retire according to the provisions of the Act of Parliament.

In addition to the above-named, the following four gentlemen retire, as having been longest in office, viz:—Rev. Canon Goodman, and Messrs J. Nicol, J. Vines, and W. Abraham.

The six vacancies thus made will have to be filled at the Annual Meeting.
