Re Hospital Sunday.

Your Committee feels that the original intention of this collection is being quite lost sight of. Hospital Sunday was instituted solely for the Hospital's benefit. In Melbourne none but actual Medical Charities ever participate in the proceeds. Here, however, it is different, some Churches allocating the money as they think fit.

In one Church last year £33 16s. 3d. was the total collection. Of this sum the Hospital only received £11 15s. 5d.; in another £20 16s. 7d. was collected: here again the Hospital only received £8 as its share.

It will be seen from these figures that the Fund is being directed into other channels not in any way connected with the Hospital. It is the intention of your Committee this year to respectfully ask the Churches to take up a collection entirely for the Institution.

It is not for a moment contended that the Societies who have previously participated, are not in every way worthy of loyal support, but it is held that a collection taken up under the name of Hospital Sunday should be given to the Hospital for its sole benefit. Many of those who give have expressed this opinion, and cases have come to our knowledge where the money has been sent direct in order that it may reach its proper destination.

Re Legacies, Bequests, &c.

The Committee especially desires to bring the needs of the Hospital before those charitably disposed persons who may wish to perpetuate their memory by helping to alleviate the sufferings of the sick poor. It is some years since the Institution has been the recipient of any legacy, and is now without an Endowment Fund.

The Committee hopes that the bringing of this fact prominently before the public will remove the false impression entertained by some persons that the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum is a wealthy Institution, and is not in need of financial aid.

Inspector of Charities Report.

Mr. F. T. Short, Inspector of Charities, visited the Institution on 1st October. The following are extracts from his Report to the Hon. the Treasurer of Victoria:—

“ During the financial year ended 30th June, 1899, there has been a substantial increase in the principal sources of revenue, while the expenditure in several of the items has been greatly curtailed.

“ The Committee are to be congratulated on a very successful year. It is suggested, however, that the Committee might make efforts to increase the amount received from entertainments.

“ The average stay of Hospital cases last year was 32 days for males, and 23 days for females, which is reasonable, particularly as there were a large number of typhoid and diphtheria patients.”

Re Subscribers' Tickets.

At the wish of the Government a new and more stringent form of ticket has been adopted for both out and in-door patients. The Government points out that cases of imposition on Hospitals are becoming very frequent, and requests that subscribers should be urged to make searching enquiry into the circumstances of patients before granting tickets of admission.

The Committee respectfully directs the attention of subscribers to this request, and expresses the hope that it may be complied with, and would earnestly urge that when granting tickets, subscribers will take special care to see that the declaration of inability to pay is in all cases duly signed and witnessed.

Visitors' Monthly Reports.

The usual monthly visits were carried out by each member of Committee in turn, and with the exception of a few minute details, were always of a very favorable character. Any matter requiring attention was immediately taken in hand by the House Committee.

Throughout the year no complaints were received by the visitors either from inmates or patients, although every opportunity was given them to do so.

Collections in State Schools.

Collecting cards were sent to every School in the district, and the amount collected, viz., £80 15s. 3d., by the children is very gratifying, and a really substantial help to the Institution.

The thanks of the Committee are herewith gratefully tendered to the children for their zeal in the cause of humanity, and to the head teachers who, by giving their kind help and interest to the movement, made it so successful.

Gifts in Kind.

The residents of the District are reminded that such articles as vegetables, fruit, firewood, warm clothing, old linen, &c., are always very acceptable. Many people cannot afford to give a donation in money, but would never miss a case or two of fruit, a bag of onions or potatoes. It is hoped that those owning farms and orchards will remember this!

Entertainments in Aid.

Although the Institution has benefited by the efforts made to raise funds by this means, there is no doubt that much more might be done in this direction with very satisfactory results.

In view of the highly successful literary and musical competitions lately held, it is suggested that something of the same kind might be worked up in aid of the Hospital, as it is evident they hit the popular taste, and while helping the cause of charity would be of value from an educational standpoint.

Re Proposed Typhoid and Diphtheria Ward.

Your Committee has nothing but disappointment to report with respect to this. After innumerable delays the Central Board of Health sanctioned the erection of a Ward on proposed site at rear of Hospital. Plans were submitted to the Board, and every preparation made to collect the balance of money required. Considerable expense was incurred in printing, &c., but before the appeal to the Public could be launched, letters were received from the Central Board of Health and Lands Department intimating that the Minister of Education was opposed to the scheme, and its erection on proposed site at rear of Hospital could not be sanctioned.

A subsequent letter was received from the Central Board saying that as far as it was concerned the Ward might be erected.

The responsibility of stopping the building of a proper Ward for the treatment of above-named diseases thus rests with the Minister of Education and the Local Board of Advice. Your Committee has tried to do its best in the interest of the town and of the patients, but owing to the strong opposition shown has failed.

The position, however, will have to be faced by the Municipalities and Councils concerned, as the Hospital cannot go on admitting Typhoid and Diphtheria for treatment in its Surgical and Medical Wards. This has been done in the past at great inconvenience and considerable risk to other patients. The means are at hand to remedy this long felt want, but owing to the active hostility of a minority they cannot be taken advantage of.

Re Municipal Grants.

The small amount received from the Municipal bodies during the year, viz., £97 10s., renders it imperative that some better understanding should be arrived at.

It has been frequently stated before that the Hospital admits typhoid and diphtheria against its own rules, relieving the various public bodies of all further expense and responsibility. Efforts have from time to time been made to induce the Councils to respond more liberally, but without much effect.

In Colac the local Council gave its Hospital £80 last year. This is within £17 10s. of the whole sum donated by the Shires and Councils of the town and district to this Institution for the same period.

Your Committee contemplates inviting a meeting of the representatives of the public bodies during the ensuing year to discuss the question fully with them.

Charities Fete & Fire Brigades Demonstration.

The second annual Charities' Fete was held during the year in aid of the Charities of the town, and your Institution received £22 12s. 9d. as its share. The weather was, unfortunately, very adverse to a large attendance of the public, and the Chinese who assisted so loyally the year before refused to turn out unless they received payment. This is to be regretted, as they are always carefully nursed and tended when seeking admission.

On behalf of the Subscribers, your Committee desires to tender its grateful thanks to Messrs. J. J. Trait, C. Brownlow and A. J. Young, the joint Honorary Secretaries and Treasurer, for the unremitting energy and resource which they displayed in organising the Fete; also to the Committee and all those gentlemen who gave their valuable time and services to make the affair a success. It is sincerely hoped that this esteemed aid to the Geelong charities will be again held during the coming year.

The Geelong Fire Brigade very kindly organised a Demonstration in aid of the Institution, which was held in December. The whole of the proceeds, viz., £61 7s., were handed to the Hospital. The sincere thanks of your Committee are tendered to ex-Captain Keon, Chairman; Lieut.-Col. Rashleigh and C. Wilcox, Secretaries; and H. Blomfield Brown, Treasurer, who by their enterprise and energy brought the Demonstration to such a successful issue. The Committee, Firemen and others who took part or gave prizes are also gratefully thanked. The hope is expressed that the Demonstration will be repeated again next Summer.

Honorary Medical Staff.

The Honorary Medical Staff consists of Drs. Newman, Marwood, Kennedy, and McCallum, with Drs. Croker and Small as Honorary Consulting Surgeons. The first four now retire, but are eligible for re-election.

On behalf of the Subscribers, the thanks of the Committee are tendered to these gentlemen for their kind attention to the patients during the year.

Staff.

Dr. G. A. Knight, Senior Resident Surgeon, having completed his term of office according to the regulations, retired in May. Dr. R. G. McPhee was then appointed Senior, and Dr. H. Catford as Junior Assistant Medical Officer.

Miss I. Bolton, Matron, left in April to proceed to South Africa, and Mrs. C. Denham, who resigned two and a half years ago, was re-appointed.

Several of the training nurses having finished their three years' course, left to undertake responsible positions in other Hospitals, where they are giving every satisfaction.

Gift of Ice.

Throughout the whole of last Summer and Autumn Messrs. Humble and Nicholson repeated their generosity of the year before, and supplied Ice *ad libitum* free of charge. The grateful thanks of the Committee are hereby tendered to these gentlemen for their beneficence. The equivalent of this gift in money would amount to a handsome sum.

Votes of Thanks.

The thanks of the Committee and Subscribers are hereby tendered to the Ladies' Flower Mission for their labour of love in supplying flowers throughout the year to patients and inmates; to Mr. H. McGregor for loan of flags; to Messrs. Webber & Son for supplying sawdust without charge; to Mrs. Bromley for obtaining servants, etc., gratis, and to all those societies and

individuals who have given or promoted Concerts or Entertainments in aid of the funds, or for the amusement of the patients and inmates. The press is also gratefully thanked for the manner in which it has at all times published the proceedings of the Committee, and in advocating the requirements of the Institution financially; also the Proprietors of the following papers, viz.—Australasian, Argus, Age, Leader, Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Ballarat Star, Ballarat Courier, and Advocate, for the gratuitous supply of their papers, which are much appreciated.

Christmas Festival.

The grateful thanks of your Committee and the inmates are tendered to all who, by their unselfish generosity and practical sympathy, helped to make the Xmas. season such a happy and bountiful one at the Hospital for the patients and inmates. Two Members of the House Committee, Messrs. Munday and Jullien, very kindly gave two whole days at the busiest season of the year for the purpose of canvassing towards this, and it was due to their special efforts that the appeal was so successful. Nearly everyone who was asked responded so readily and freely that the usually unpleasant business of begging became a pleasure.

If the kind-hearted people who gave could have seen the look of happiness light up on many a poor old face, and young ones too, for that matter, they would have been amply repaid.

Obituary.

With great regret we have to record the death of Mr. H. T. Howard, a former member of Committee, who took an active interest in the welfare of the Institution.

General Committee of Management.

The Hon. Sidney Austin, M.L.A., President, resigned his position in December owing to pressure of business, and Mr. Geo. Martin, Vice-President, was unanimously voted to the Presidentship.

Mr. J. Nicol was elected as Vice-President, and the vacancy thus created was filled by the election of Mr. F. J. Leary.

The Rev. E. O'Brien, owing to his removal to Melbourne, resigned in March, and the Venerable Arch-Priest M'Kenna was elected to fill his place. He resigned as a Member of Committee in July. Mr. J. Vines resigned in January on leaving for Ballarat, and Mr. W. C. Kernot was elected instead. Mr. S. Jacobs, owing to business engagements, tendered his resignation as a Member of Committee in May. His seat will be filled at the Annual Meeting. The Members thus elected retire in accordance with your rules, but are all eligible for re-election.

These vacancies, with four others, making the statutory six, will have to be filled at the forthcoming Annual Meeting.

In March last the Rev. A. Davidson, in view of an intended trip to Europe, tendered his resignation. Your Committee, recognising the value of his services to the Hospital, declined to accept it, but unanimously voted him leave of absence during his tour, and gave him a letter as a credential in order that he might visit similar Institutions in the older lands.

Committees.

Tables are attached showing that during the past year 18 meetings of the General Committee of Management, 50 of the House Committee, and 13 of the Finance Committee have been held.

The thanks of the Subscribers are due to the Members of these Committees for their regular attendance.

Final.

The Committee, before closing this Report, would again draw the attention of the Public to the important work done by this combined Institution in alleviating human distress and suffering, and while returning sincere and grateful thanks to those who have in any way assisted in the past, cannot too strongly urge the necessity for a continued and increased support for this charity.

Many there are in our midst well able to assist who have hitherto contributed nothing, and we would earnestly ask such to seriously consider the claims upon them of an Institution which appeals more powerfully perhaps than any other to the sympathies of those whose duty it is to assist so far as lies in their power in alleviating the distress of their more unfortunate fellow creatures.

The members of your Committee who have been longest in office, and therefore retire under the provisions of the Act regulating the Charities, in addition to the Venerable Arch-Priest M'Kenna, Messrs. F. J. Leary and W. C. Kernot previously mentioned, are Messrs. G. S. Faulkner, W. Higgins and F. J. Lullian. These gentlemen are all well.

Many there are in our midst well able to assist who have hitherto contributed nothing, and we would earnestly ask such to seriously consider the claims upon them of an Institution which appeals more powerfully perhaps than any other to the sympathies of those whose duty it is to assist so far as lies in their power in alleviating the distress of their more unfortunate fellow creatures.

The members of your Committee who have been longest in office, and therefore retire under the provisions of the Act regulating the Charities, in addition to the Venerable Arch-Priest M'Kenna, Messrs. F. J. Leary and W. C. Kernot previously mentioned, are Messrs. G. S. Faulkner, W. Higgins and E. L. Jullien. These gentlemen are all eligible for re-election.

The Committee desire to record their appreciation of the manner in which the Superintendent, Mr. A. J. Reilly, has conducted the duties of his position. Kindliness with efficiency has been his aim, and he has been ably assisted by the whole staff, and it is with no little pleasure we acknowledge their efforts.

EXTRACTS FROM BYE-LAWS.

OBJECTS.

Bye-Law No. 2.

That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it ; to a limited number of paying patients whose admission, under special circumstances, may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management ; and for casualties, but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the objects of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

Bye-Law No. 3.

That a portion of one of the buildings shall be set apart for the purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of Lunatics on remand for medical examination in a ward erected for that purpose.

CONSTITUTION.

Bye-Law No. 4.

The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

Bye-Law No. 5.

The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors, and Honorary Collectors, viz :—

£50, personal contribution in one year—Life Governor.

£20 " " " " " Life Subscriber.

£50 Bequest under will, first named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will. } Governor for one year.

£20 Society, Association, or Company collecting or paying in one year (to nominate for each £20 collected or paid). } Life Subscriber.

£1 or upwards, Minister of Church or Layman collecting in one year. } Honorary Collector.

£1 and upwards, yearly subscription—Contributor.

Provided always that no minister, congregation, association, society, company, or person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived

from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6.

Life Governors will be entitled to recommend—

1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books).

Life Subscriber—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually.

Governor for 1 Year—

10 In and 20 Out-Patients.

Contributor—

1 In and 2 Out-patients annually for each £1 subscribed.

Honorary Collector—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law No. 7.

Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall be only used for the recommendation of persons **unable** to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and the accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and vice versa, one In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.

Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.

At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes; £3 3s., two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

Bye-Law No. 12.

An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

(1.) To receive the Report of the Committee of Management and Audited Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the year to 30th June preceding.

(2.) For the election of President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors for the ensuing year.

(3.) The election of Members of the Committee of Management to fill vacancies.

(4.) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting connected with the Institution.

Bye-Law No. 13.

If required by the Committee of Management or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee, or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of the Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

Bye-Law No. 14.

All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, for at least one week previous to such meeting.

Bye-Law No. 15.

At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

Bye-Law No. 16.

Ten Contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of Contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

Bye-Law No. 17.

Every question submitted to a General Meeting, and all elections shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors present entitled to vote, and shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote, in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken; and such elections by ballot shall be held on such day and such place as the Committee shall have determined, and shall have notified by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong three clear days before the said general meeting; and at such ballot all Governors and Contributors who are entitled to and desire to vote shall attend in their proper persons; and the poll shall be kept open from three o'clock p.m. to eight o'clock p.m., and the Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of such election, and for the proper counting of the votes, and the publication of the result.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.**Bye-Law No. 58.**

Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket; and the admission of patients, in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.**Bye-Law No. 59.**

Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.

The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to, and be observed by all paying patients.

PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

Bye-Law No. 61.

No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accidents or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where Hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

Bye-Law No. 62.

The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a sub-committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
