Annual average cost per head, £36 1s. 6d. The daily average has been 20 less than last year, which has the effect of raising the cost per head, as the same staff has to be employed whether the Hospital is full or otherwise. Again it costs as much to light and warm a ward for a dozen patients as it would for thirty, so that it is apparent to all that a low daily average of patients means a high cost per head. The comforting satisfaction to know is that the whole district has been for some time remarkably healthy.

## Charge for Drugs to Out-Patients.

Those who are too poor to pay the small charge made are never pressed to do so, but careful enquiry is made in each case.

## Financial and General.

Owing to the absence of any epidemic diseases the daily average has been lower this year than for some time past, which necessarily makes the cost per patient appear higher. The price of provisions has also increased to an alarming degree through drought and other causes. Added to this is the greatly increased cost of modern surgery. This increased cost is, however, justified by results.

The surgeon of to-day boldly and successfully undertakes operations which twenty years ago would have been thought impossible, and consequently were not treated by surgery. Further, the importance of having every appliance absolutely sterile is in itself very costly, but very necessary.

No falling off has taken place in the private subscriptions, notwithstanding the heavy demands made upon public benevolence for patriotic and similar funds.

The smaller amount received from in-patients is accounted for by there having been fewer treated.

That there has been no relaxation of effort to get all patients to contribute what they can afford is evidenced by the fact that patients' moneys increased the revenue by £823, being only 12 % less than the private contributions and municipal grants put together. Lest it might appear that undue pressure is brought to bear to secure contributions from patients, it may be stated that in practically all cases the patient volunteers the amount of his or her contribution weekly when the necessity is explained to them, and they are not likely to promise more than they can afford.

It should be remarked that though not a children's hospital a large percentage of the patients, both in and out, treated at the Geelong Hospital, are children, and no child is ever refused treatment, mothers having at times been allowed to reside in the Hospital to be with and comfort their very young children. These facts should be borne in mind when appeals for monetary help are received from Metropolitan institutions, as the canvassing of the town and district by outside charities must in a great measure divert funds from our local Hospital.

## Honorary Medical Staff.

The Honorary Medical Staff consists of Drs. Newman, Marwood, Kennedy and McCallum, with Drs. Croker and Small as Honorary Consulting Surgeons. The first four now retire, but are eligible for re-election.

On behalf of the Subscribers the thanks of the Committee are tendered to these gentlemen for their kind attention to the patients during the year.

## **Renovating, &c.**

The Institution having now been built for 50 years, is feeling the effects of time, and is constantly in need of repairs and renovations. The cost of keeping such an old building in ordinary repair is very great, and should not be compared with more modern edifices. The hope is expressed that it will be possible in the future to rebuild the Hospital throughout, replacing it with a structure built on the most approved and up-to-date ideas. The only thing that prevents this is the want of money to carry it through. During the past year £308 has been expended in renovations and repairs, and an equal amount will have to be spent during the coming twelve months.

## ***Re Municipal Grants.***

The smallness of the Grants made by the Municipal bodies was again drawn attention to by the Government Inspector in his report to the Premier, as compared with other districts.

With the possibility of further reductions in the near future in the Government Grant, it will be absolutely necessary to come to a proper understanding with the Councils if the present system of receiving their diphtheria and typhoid patients is to continue.

During a recent small epidemic of diphtheria the institution was put to great straits through admitting these patients, four of the nurses contracting the disease at the same time. The closing of the wards to these cases was seriously considered had the epidemic increased, which it fortunately did not.

An arrangement with each Council to pay so much per week for each case of contagious disease coming from their town or district would enable the Hospital Committee to engage special nurses when they were wanted. At present the finances will not admit of this being done.

The various Municipal authorities are earnestly requested to consider some such scheme as this, which obtains in nearly every other part of Victoria.

The Committee is anxious to do the best it can in the interests of the public, and only asks for a fair arrangement with the responsible bodies. At present the treatment of these cases unduly diminishes the funds which are provided for the use of surgical and medical wards.

### *Re Legacies, Bequests, &c.*

A small Endowment Fund has been started, and it is sincerely hoped by your Committee that it will continue to grow. With this object in view your Committee wishes to bring the urgent need of such a Fund prominently before those who are able and willing to help.

The memory of contributors is kept green by being recorded on tablets in porch, which will be read and pondered by generations long after the generous and kindly hearted donors have departed.

### **Old Age Pensions.**

This scheme of providing for the aged poor still continues. It is the opinion of your Committee that the majority of those in receipt of this form of relief would be better in every way if properly looked after in some well conducted Asylum. There is no gainsaying the fact that old people, when left to themselves, drift into bad health and die from neglected ailments, which if taken in time need not be fatal. Quite a number of those who were granted a pension when the Act first became law, have returned to the Hospital to die before their time. Others again have been re-admitted to the Benevolent Asylum, having lost their pensions through spending them in drink. The Act is now being administered with far more discretion, careful enquiries being made by the police in each case.

## Collections in State Schools.

A collection was again taken up during the year by the children of the town and district with very gratifying results, £81 17s. 4d. being received. The head teachers and the children assisting are gratefully thanked for their help.

It is hoped that this otherwise unobtainable source of revenue will continue to grow, as children make splendid collectors, and the pennies given by contributors are never missed. It is intended during the coming year to give a handsome ornamental card to those who collect 10/-, besides the certificate now issued to collectors of 5/-

## **Inspector of Charities Report.**

Mr. F. T. Short, Inspector of Charities, visited the Institution on 22nd November. The following are extracts from his Report to the Hon. the Treasurer of Victoria :—

There is an increase in the amount of Municipal Grant during last year. The rate for daily average is, however, only £1 12s. 4d. compared with the mean rate of £4 9s. 7d. The local contributions were very good, the rate for daily average being £19 15s. 3d. compared with the mean rate of £12 9s. 1d. The necessary declarations and particulars in support thereof in regard to the admission of patients were obtained in each case. I am pleased to be in a position to compliment the Committee on the great improvement that has taken place during the last few years. The Hospital is particularly well managed, and the building and grounds are in every way a credit to the management.

## **Gifts in Kind.**

The appeals in former Reports for gifts of fruit, vegetables, firewood, worn clothing, old linen, &c., have not, it is regretted, met with much response.

If the public realised how very acceptable such gifts are your Committee feels sure that the appeal would not have such poor results.

## **Entertainments in Aid.**

The thanks of the Committee are gratefully tendered to all those who have in any way assisted by organising entertainments.

Much more might be done, however, especially in the town, to help the Institution in this direction, and it is hoped that during the coming year many of the clever amateur vocalists and instrumentalists resident in our midst will use their gifts for the benefit of the Institution.

## *Re Hospital Sunday.*

Your Committee gratefully recognises the support given to the Institution by Hospital Sunday contributors, and now tender their sincere thanks to the many Churches who, in response to the Committee's appeal, have sent the amounts direct to the Hospital. Forty-eight Churches last year acted thus, and your Committee confidently anticipate that in a short time the whole of the contributing Churches will do the same, and thus assist the Committee in making Hospital Sunday really what its name implies.

## **Visitors' Monthly Reports.**

Throughout the year monthly visits were carried out by each member of the General Committee in turn. They always made a careful and scrutinising inspection. Their reports were invariably of a very favourable character. Minor improvements and details were pointed out and acted upon. All inmates and patients have an opportunity given them of bringing any cause of complaint before the Committee. During the period under review no complaint of any importance was brought before the visitors.

## **Staff.**

Dr. Major resigned his position as junior resident Medical Officer and Dispenser in August, and Dr. T. A. McLean was appointed in his stead. Dr. R. G. McPhee, Senior Resident Medical Officer, resigned in September, and Dr. McLean was promoted to his position. Dr. P. M. Shackell was then given the post of Junior Resident Medical Officer, and Mr. N. Pardey was appointed as Non Resident Dispenser. In April Dr. Shackell resigned, and it was decided to revert to the old system of having only one resident Doctor, no appointment was therefore made to fill his place. This arrangement necessitated a slight re-arrangement of the duties, and the Hon. Medical Staff now take out-patients on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday in each week, the Resident Surgeon seeing them on Wednesday and Saturday, instead of every day in the week,

In April the Matron, Mrs. Denham, was taken ill, and was granted 3 months' sick leave; Sister Robertson being appointed temporarily as acting Matron.

thanks of the Committee are also conveyed for its courtesy at all times, and for advocating the requirements of the Institution financially; also the proprietors of the following papers, viz.—Australasian, Argus, Age, Leader, Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Ballarat Star, Ballarat Courier, and Advocate, for the gratuitous supply of their papers, which are much appreciated.

## Xmas. Dinner.

The Patients and Inmates sat down to their usual feast on Christmas Day. Everything that they could wish for was provided. The donors of the repast are gratefully thanked for their splendid generosity. A list of the givers is printed further on in the Report.

## Obituary.

With great regret we have to record the death of the Rev. Allan W. Webb, a member of the General Committee, who for many years took an active interest in the welfare of the Institution.

## Board of Management.

In May last the lamented death of the Rev. Allan W. Webb caused a vacancy on the Board, and subsequently the Rev. T. Vigis was elected by the Managers to fill the same. The Rev. S. Knight resigned his seat in April, and the Rev. W. Williams was also elected to fill his place. Mr. J. H. Peebles lost his seat through non attendance in October, but was re-elected. In accordance with the Bye-Laws these gentlemen now retire, but are all eligible for re-election.

## Conclusion.

The Committee desires to again thank all those who have helped the Institution financially or otherwise, and thus enabled them to record a successful year's work. Owing to causes previously alluded to, the Committee has had to contend with many difficulties, notwithstanding which the Institution has for the fourth consecutive year been kept free from debt.

In accordance with the Rules, the following gentlemen, viz., Messrs. Williams, Vigis, Peebles, Small, Brown, and Gardiner retire, their term of office having expired, but they are all eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

Your Committee desire to express their appreciation of the manner the Officers and Staff of the Institution have performed their several duties, and note with much satisfaction the energy and attention of the Secretary and Superintendent.

In conclusion the Committee hopes that in the future the public will still continue to give a generous support to an Institution which aims to help the sick and suffering poor, and to provide a home for those who have been stranded in the storm and stress of life's battles.

## Extracts from Bye-Laws.

---

### OBJECTS.

#### Bye-Law No. 2.

That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of paying patients whose admission, under special circumstances, may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the objects of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

### APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

#### Bye-Law No. 3.

That a portion of one of the buildings shall be set apart for the purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of Lunatics on remand for medical examination in a ward erected for that purpose.

### CONSTITUTION.

#### Bye-Law No. 4.

The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

### QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

#### Bye-Law No. 5.

The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors and Honorary Collectors, viz:—

£50, personal contribution in one year—Life Governor.

Provided always that no minister, congregation, association, society, company or person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived

from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

#### Bye-Law No. 6.

Life Governors will be entitled to recommend—

1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books.)

Life Subscriber—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually.

Governor for 1 Year—

10 In and 20 Out-Patients.

Contributor—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 subscribed.

Honorary Collector—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 collected.

#### Bye-Law No. 7.

Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall be only used for the recommendation of persons **unable** to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and the accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and vice versa, one In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

#### Bye-Law No. 8.

Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

#### Bye-Law No. 9.

At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes; £3 3s., two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

### GENERAL MEETINGS.

#### Bye-Law No. 12.

An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

- (1.) To receive the Report of the Committee of Management and Audited Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding,
- (2.) For the election of President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- (3.) The election of Members of the Committee of Management to fill vacancies.
- (4.) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting connected with the Institution.

**Bye-Law No. 13.**

If required by the Committee of Management or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee, or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of the Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

**Bye-Law No. 14.**

All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, for at least one week previous to such meeting.

**Bye-Law No. 15.**

At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

**Bye-Law No. 16.**

Ten Contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of Contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

**Bye-Law No. 17.**

Every question submitted to a General Meeting, and all elections shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors present entitled to vote, and shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote, in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken; and such elections by ballot shall be held on such day and such place as the Committee shall have determined, and shall have notified by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong three clear days before the said general meeting; and at such ballot all Governors and Contributors who are entitled to and desire to vote shall attend in their proper persons; and the poll shall be kept open from three o'clock p.m. to eight o'clock p.m., and the Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of such election, and for the proper counting of the votes, and the publication of the result.

**ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.****Bye-Law No. 58.**

Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more an In-Patient's Ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients, in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee, at its next meeting.

**ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.****Bye-Law No. 59.**

Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

## Bye-Law No. 60.

The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to, and be observed by all paying patients.

## PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

## Bye-Law No. 61.

No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accidents or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where Hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

## ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

## Bye-Law No. 62.

The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

## PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a sub-committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.


