Committee of Management.

To the Governors and Subscribers.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee of Management begs to submit to the Subscribers and the Public their Fifty-First Annual Report and Audited Balance Sheet, with a synopsis of the Finances of the Institution.

The past year has been one of unprecedented depression over all the State, and the Institution has suffered through reduced subscriptions from the Public, and £550 less from Government Grant.

Average cost per head, £32 17s. 7d. Considering the continued high price of all provisions, wood, coal, &c., this may be reckoned a very low cost for each individual treated, and is £3 9s. 11d. per head below last year's average cost.

Financial and General.

The receipts for Maintenance during the year were £5591 3s. 7d., and the total expenditure under this heading was £5430 2s. 3d.

The amount to the credit of the Endowment Fund is £2801 2s. 6d., and of the Reserve Fund, £1619 10s.

As before mentioned, the Government Grant was reduced by £550 from that of the previous year. This has been a staggering blow, which no amount of retrenchment or careful management can hope to nullify. The trend of Government Policy appears to be to make the Charitable Institutions depend more and more upon local support, and less upon State aid. This would work well enough if the local public as a body could be brought into the giving frame of mind, but how to do it? The average working man undoubtedly, cannot spare much from his small income, but he can spare a little, and if every man in receipt of regular wages in the District would give 1d. per week towards the Hospital, there would be no need to be so constantly crying out for more help.

During the past year efforts have been again made to obtain an increase from the

Factory and Workshop Employes' Subscriptions,

by asking the managers and employers for permission to send a collecting box to receive small voluntary contributions of say, 1d. each pay day. It is with regret that we have to report that in only a few cases has the suggestion been adopted, and permission given to forward a box. It is still hoped, however, that from the small beginning now made, the system will grow. Without something of this sort, the time cannot be far distant when a Charity Tax must inevitably come, and in a way it would be the most equable system of supporting our Charities, which are chiefly maintained—as far as voluntary subscriptions go—by about 10% of the population. The remaining 90%, from whom most of our patients and inmates are drawn, are unfortunately, non-contributors. It should be remembered that the large hospitals at home have been endowed by benevolent persons perhaps two or more hundred years ago, with land and property, which renders them much more independent than similar institutions in these States. This brings us to a much needed want in this Hospital, namely

Endowed Beds,

Which are numerous in old world hospitals. The system of endowing a bed in perpetuating the memory of deceased relatives is again respectfully suggested to those able and willing to do so; also to those who may be disposed to signalize any particular year by giving a Special Donation, the maintenance of a bed is commended. The estimated cost of each bed on an average of years is £75. We are glad to report that the Comunn Na Feinne Society has this matter under consideration, with a view of endowing a bed.

Re New Hospital.

This matter, though much discussed some 9 years ago, has been in abeyance for a considerable time. The question will have to be seriously considered in the near future, as in the present building there are signs of subsidence in the foundations, and erosion of the stone of which it is built. Several of the Wards too, are not well lighted, which is considered most important in these days of hygiene.

Improvements and Repairs.

A brick cemented dust-bin has been erected for reception of cinders until they are taken away by sanitary cart; also a brick incinerator with chimney, for destroying by fire dressings, bandages and infected material of every description. This does away with all rubbish, and supplies a long-felt want. Two new washing machines are on their way out from Scotland for erection in the laundry—one for linen articles, the other for blankets and woollens. The cost is heavy, viz., £200 landed in Geelong, but the machines will save a considerable sum annually in wages, and after very careful enquiries your Committee felt justified in their purchase.

The Institution's carpenter and painter have been kept fully occupied in painting and repairs all over the building, which on account of its age requires a lot of paint annually to keep it looking ordinarily respectable. In addition, a considerable lot of outside painting, which was pressing, had to be done by an outside firm.

Adoption of the Burdett System of Bookkeeping.

An important change has been made this year in the system of keeping the Institution's Accounts. This was made obligatory by order of the Government, in order to secure a uniform system of Accounts, and Burdett's system was selected as that generally approved and adopted by the principal English hospitals. The Balance Sheet presented this year has therefore been prepared according to the Burdett method.

Old Age Pensioners.

During the year no fewer than 37 pensioners have been treated as in-patients in the wards of the Hospital, and many of them have had to be buried at the expense of the Institution's funds. Some of these were former inmates of the Benevolent Asylum, and to obtain the pension left the Institution with the result here recorded. No contribution whatever has been made towards the maintenance of these patients, either by the Government or by the patients themselves.

Your Committee considers that while the pensioners are comfortably housed and nursed at the Hospital, part at least of their pension should be contributed towards the funds of the Institution by which they are maintained. At present the Government will not allow Hospitals to accept a penny of a pensioner's money.

Appeal to the Municipalities for Increased Grants.

With one exception, no success has attended the appeal made to the Municipalities for increased grants. While thanking them for their contributions, we desire again to point out that in nearly all cases these contributions are quite out of proportion to the extent of the benefit they derive from the Hospital. The fact that the Geelong Infirmary not only discharges the functions of a general hospital, but also does the work of a partly Infectious Diseases Hospital, is quite ignored by the Municipal bodies, who are nevertheless responsible for providing treatment for these cases.

The Nurses' Training School

Still maintains its popularity and usefulness. There are about 150 applicants on the books for appointment. An event of importance to training nurses, and one that will tend to raise the general standard of knowledge of their profession, has been the inauguration of the Victorian Trained Nurses Association, with which the Hospital is now connected. The Association aims at making the examination of all trained nurses equal wherever they may be trained, and will in future provide a Board of Examiners, which will expect and exact a high order of excellence, which will work for the advantage of the nursing profession.

The Honorary Medical Staff

Still consists of Drs. Newman, Marwood, Kennedy, and McCallum, with Drs. Croker and Small as Honorary Consulting Surgeons. The first four now retire, but are eligible for re-election. On behalf of the Subscribers, the thanks of the Committee are tendered to these gentlemen for their kind attention to the patients during the year.

The Inspector of Charities,

Mr. F. T. Short, visited the Institution during the year. The following are extracts from his Report to the Hon. the Treasurer:—"The Municipal Grant to this Institution is small, the rate for daily average being only £1 10s. 8d., compared with the mean rate of £4 9s. 6d. The estimated cost of out-patients was £203. The necessary declarations and particulars in regard thereto required by the ticket of admission were obtained. In this Institution particularly, care is exercised to obtain contributions from all patients in a position to give, and during last year an amount of £823 was obtained from this source. The Committee and Superintendent are to be commended for the excellent management of this Institution."

Visitors' Monthly Reports

Have been regularly received throughout the year. They were always of a very favourable character.

A few minor details were mentioned, and promptly attended to. No complaints were received from the patients or inmates.

Infectious Diseases Ward Fund.

The sum of £1264 16s. is lying at Fixed Deposit in Bank pending the erection of this building.

The Collections

In State Schools were taken up by the children, who with the teachers, are gratefully thanked for their kind help. It is with regret that we have to report that the sum collected was about £23 short of former years. The hope is expressed that it may again grow to its former figures. The money, if not collected this way, cannot be obtained in any other, as it is the result of penny subscriptions. For every £1 collected the teachers are forwarded tickets, which enables them to recommend any of their little charges for admission should they be so unfortunate as to require medical aid and nursing.

Board of Management.

In August last Mr. G. S. Faulkner resigned his seat, and Mr. A. Collier was appointed by the Managers to fill the vacancy. He now retires in accordance with the Bye-Laws, but is eligible for re-election.

The Rev. Canon Goodman, M.A. (who from advancing years is desirous of vacating his seat), has relinquished his position on the Board of Management, which he has occupied for the last 29 years. Canon Goodman has always manifested the greatest interest in the welfare of the Institution.

This Committee records their heartiest sense of his usefulness, and faithful discharge of the duties of Committeeman during the long series of years he has been connected with the Hospital, and while regretting the loss of his wise counsel and help, trusts the God whom he has served so long may yet spare him for further active service in His ministry.

Committees.

During the year 14 meetings of the General Committee of Management, 52 of the House Committee, and 12 of the Finance Committee have been held.

The thanks of the Subscribers are due to the gentlemen of these Committees for the assiduous way in which they have looked after the interests of the Institution.

Extracts from Bye-Laws.

OBJECTS.

Bye-Law No. 2.

That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of paying patients whose admission, under special circumstances, may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the objects of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

Bye-Law No. 3.

That a portion of one of the buildings shall be set apart for the purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of Lunatics on remand for medical examination in a ward erected for that purpose.

CONSTITUTION.

Bye-Law No. 4.

The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Governors and Contributors.

QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

Bye-Law No. 5.

The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors and Honorary Collectors, viz :—

£50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor.

£20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber.

£50 Bequest under will, first named
or acting executor (bequest under
will) under such will. } Governor for one year.

£20 Society, Association, or Com-
pany collecting or paying in one
year (to nominate for each £20
collected or paid). } Life Subscriber.

£1 and upwards, Minister of Church } Honorary
or Layman collecting in one year } Collector.

£1 and upwards, yearly subscription—Contributor.

Provided always that no minister, congregation, association, society, company or person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through

one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6.

Life Governors will be entitled to recommend—

1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books).

Life Subscriber—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually.

Governor for 1 Year—

10 In and 20 Out-Patients.

Contributor—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 subscribed.

Honorary Collector—

1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law No. 7.

Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management and provided that the funds and the accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and vice versa, one In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.

Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.

At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes; £3 3s., two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

Bye-Law No. 12.

An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

(1.) To receive the Report of the Committee of Management and Audited Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the year to the 30th June, preceding.

(2.) For the election of President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors for the ensuing year.

(3.) The election of Members of the Committee of Management to fill vacancies.

(4.) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting connected with the Institution.

Bye-Law No. 13.

If required by the Committee of Management or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee, or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without delay, convene a special meeting of the Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

Bye-Law No. 14.

All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, for at least one week previous to such meeting.

Bye-Law No. 15.

At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

Bye-Law No. 16.

Ten Contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of Contributors, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

Bye-Law No. 17.

Every question submitted to a General Meeting, and all elections shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors present entitled to vote, and shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote, in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken; and such elections by ballot shall be held on such day and such place as the Committee shall have determined, and shall have notified by advertisement in one or more newspapers published in Geelong three clear days before the said general meeting; and at such ballot all Governors and Contributors who are entitled to and desire to vote shall attend in their proper persons; and the poll shall be kept open from three o'clock p.m. to eight o'clock p.m., and the Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of such election, and for the proper counting of the votes, and the publication of the result.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

Bye-Law No. 58.

Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more, an In-Patient's ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients, in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical

Staff for the week, or in the absence of such staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee, at its next meeting.

ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

Bye-Law No. 59.

Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.

The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to, and be observed by all paying patients.

PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

Bye-Law No. 61.

No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accidents or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

Bye-Law No. 62.

The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE,

All patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a sub-committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
