THE FIFTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT of the General  
Committee of Management.

## To the Governors and Subscribers.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Board of Management of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum have the honour to submit for the information of the Governors, the Subscribers, and the General Public, their Fifty-Second Annual Report of the condition and progress of the Institution for the year ending 30th June, 1904, together with an Audited Balance Sheet and a Synopsis of the Finances.

The latter part of the year has been marked by the excessive number of Diphtheria cases admitted, which has been a great strain on the resources of the Hospital, both from a financial and nursing point of view. Sixty-two patients have been treated for this disease, with only two deaths. No case was refused admission, but the difficulty of treating this most infectious complaint is very great in the present building, as no proper system of isolation is possible for the nurses. Frequently three nurses have had to be told off to nurse two cases, throwing an undue strain on those left in the surgical and medical wards.

It becomes more and more evident that a separate ward for the treatment of Diphtheria and Typhoid is an absolute necessity. Until the Councils, however, can be prevailed upon to guarantee the cost of such patients coming from their districts, who cannot pay for themselves, your Committee does not feel justified in incurring the increased expense that the up-keep of such a building would entail. The funds for its erection would be easily forthcoming, and the land is already granted.

In addition to the Diphtheria cases, 37 Typhoid patients have been treated.

Two thousand one hundred and eighty-eight cases have received relief. Full particulars are given in the following table:—

**Financial and General.**—The receipts for maintenance during the year were £5678 6s. 10d., and the total expenditure under this heading was £5726 9s. 1d.

A deficiency of £48 was the result of the year's transactions. The purchase and erection of washing machines at a cost of about £240 accounts for this. They are labour saving, and will also save money as time goes on.

The amount to the credit of the Endowment Fund is £3522 13s. 8d., and of the Reserve Fund £1619 10s.

The reduction of the Government Grant by £550, made in the year 1902-3, was again repeated this year. Your Institution is thus receiving £550 per annum less than it formerly obtained from this source of income alone. It is only by the exercise of the most rigid economy and careful management that the ends are made to meet. It must be understood that by rigid economy we do not mean that anything required for the patients is ever done without. Whatever is necessary for their comfort or treatment is obtained, no matter what the cost.

It has been said that the authorities look too closely into the ability of patients to contribute or otherwise. This is unfair and not a fact. The House Committee considers every case weekly on its merits. No official of the Institution ever fixes or dictates the amount patients shall contribute; nor is pressure ever brought to bear upon patients who cannot contribute, and fully 60 per cent. never give anything at all. The responsibility of making careful enquiry into each patient's financial condition is thrust upon the management by the Government, and is a condition upon which the State aid is given. The Government lays it down that while there are many so poor that any payment would be quite impossible, there are also others who make use of hospitals who are not of the destitute class, who earn regular wages, though perhaps not large, and are often in receipt of sick-pay from a club. A small donation weekly from them is often expected, and frequently volunteered.

**Endowed Beds.**—It is satisfactory to report that your Institution has got an endowed bed started. The Comunn Na Feinne Society has very generously undertaken to endow a bed in perpetuity, and has paid in £100 as a first instalment. A marble tablet has been placed over the bed recording the fact. The members of the Comunn Na Feinne are gratefully thanked for their liberality and public spirit. It is hoped that other societies and individuals may follow the excellent lead made by the Comunn Na Feinne. The cost of a bed is, on an average of years, about £75.

**Improvements and Repairs.**—The washing machines, spoken of in last year's Report, are now to hand, and working satisfactorily. By their introduction it was found possible to reduce the laundry staff by two hands, which will effect a considerable saving in wages annually. The outside of Bowen wards and operating theatre have been painted with two coats, also nursing home. Much other work has also been done in the way of minor repairs.

**Collections in State Schools.**—These Penny subscriptions show a sad falling off as compared with former years. The sum of £38 5s. 5d. was collected, as compared with the average of £80, which was at one time our annual revenue from this collection. It is sincerely to be hoped that this much prized source of income will again look up during the coming years. The children and teachers who were kind enough to interest themselves in this charitable work are sincerely thanked for their trouble. Below is a list of the schools which lent their aid.

It should be mentioned that for every £1 collected one In and two Out-Patients' tickets are sent to the head teacher of each school forwarding this amount. In addition handsome coloured certificates are given to each collector of 5s. and 10s.

**The Nurses' Training School** is still progressing satisfactorily. During the year Nurses Fynney and Potter gained their certificates, and Nurse Grace had to leave through ill-health. Miss M. Little was appointed as a trainee in January last.

**The Inspector of Charities**, Mr. F. T. Short, visited the Institution during the year. In his Report to the Hon. the Treasurer of Victoria he says, *inter alia*, "The rate for daily average for Municipal Grant was £1 16s. 5d., compared with the mean rate of £4 18s. 8d. "This Institution has made repeated efforts to obtain increased Municipal support, but without much success. The cost per head during the last year was below the mean cost of similar "Institutions. I would commend the attention of the Committee to the item Surgery and "Dispensary. The amount of £477 expended on Drugs and Dressings is too high for the "number of patients treated. Apart from this item the Institution was economically managed, "and the Committee is to be congratulated on its sound financial condition."

This is one of the few Hospitals where proper efforts are made to made to obtain payments from patients in a position to contribute towards their maintenance. The amount received from this source is gratifying.

**The Visitors' Monthly Reports** have been received at each meeting of the General Committee during the year. They were always of a very satisfactory nature.

Small matters were at various times brought under notice and promptly remedied. The patients and inmates invariably spoke of their treatment with gratitude whenever they were interrogated by the visitors.

**Infectious Diseases' Ward Fund.**—The sum of £1264 is lying at Fixed Deposit in Bank towards the erection of this much needed building. As mentioned elsewhere your Committee, while daily seeing the urgent and pressing necessity for such a ward, yet recognizes that its maintenance should not, and could not, come out of the General Hospital's Maintenance Funds.

In addition to what is in hand a sum of about £900 would be required to erect and furnish the building. This should not be impossible to acquire, and your Institution is willing to give the land. The only vital question that remains is that of maintenance, and if the Municipal bodies would guarantee the cost of each case of Typhoid or Diphtheria sent from their district the problem would be easy of solution. This is done in many other Victorian towns. It should be remembered by the Councils that many of the patients would be able to contribute something towards their treatment, and that the Municipal bodies are responsible for providing a suitable and isolated building for the treatment of these diseases. Up to the present the Geelong Infirmary has done its best, taking these patients in and treating them in the midst of purely surgical and non-infectious medical cases. This state of things is to be much deplored.

**Hospital Sunday** was, unfortunately, very wet, which affected the receipts adversely. Your Committee gratefully thanks the several churches for their kindly help.

To the Hospital nurses who so loyally turned out on Hospital Saturday to collect funds the thanks of your Committee are also tendered. Further on in the Report the various amounts are acknowledged.

**Bequests and Legacies** received during the year do not reach a very high figure. £100 is the gross amount, composed as follows:—Late Jno. Daniel, £25; land, G. Grant, £5; Trustees of Edwd. Wilson, *Argus* Fund, £50; Estate of late J. L. Kininmonth, £5; Estate late Geo. Russell, £5; Estate late Capt. Ormond, £10. To those who are disposed to help the medical charities by a remembrance in their will this Institution is respectfully commended as being worthy of aid.

**Gifts in kind** are always welcome and much appreciated.

**Entertainments.**—A number of ladies organised a masked ball, which was a great financial and social success. Mesdames M. G. Bell, M. H. Wilson and I. Hodges were elected Life Subscribers on the nomination of the ball committee. The best thanks of the Committee are hereby tendered to all who assisted.

The members of the Geelong Musical Society gave a concert in aid, which resulted in a handsome donation. In connection therewith Messrs J. Ritch, F. Shrimpton and J. H. Bossence were elected Life Subscribers on the nomination of the Society. Promoters and performers are gratefully thanked.

Entertainments in aid have been more to the fore this year, and a substantial sum has been received, for which your Committee is very grateful. To all who have in any way assisted, either as performers, promoters, or subscribers, the thanks of the Committee are sincerely tendered.

**Endowment and Reserve Funds.**—These funds are, unfortunately, in a stagnant position; no additions having been made since last year. This does not appear so at the first glance, as a sum of £675 is added to the credit of Endowment Fund. This, however, is part principal of a Bequest left some years ago by the late Mr. Jno. Thompson, of Keilambete, on which the Institution has always received interest, and is merely a transfer from one account to another.

**The Operating Theatre.**—A fairly heavy year's work has been recorded at the Operating Theatre—165 operations, all more or less serious, having been performed.

The Theatre is well equipped, and the Surgeons are enabled to do excellent work under the best conditions, ably assisted by the Staff.

**A Powerful Movable Electric Lamp** would prove a great boon, so that a brilliant light could be concentrated on any desired spot on operating table. Possibly some wealthy patron may feel disposed to supply this on hearing of our need.

**The Sterilizing Plant** has worked well. This part of Hospital routine has to be performed with extraordinary care to ensure aseptic conditions, which can only be obtained by maintaining the Sterilizing Plant in a state of high efficiency.

**Staff.**—Dr. T. A. McLean resigned in February last, and Dr. C. A. Maxwell was appointed in his stead.

**Life Subscribers.**—The following have been elected Life Subscribers during the year, in recognition of generous personal donations, or for promoting successful entertainments:—Mr. A. McIntyre, nominated by Mt. Moriac Concert and Ball Committee; Mr. G. Mayo, nominated by Meredith Ball Committee; Mrs. M. G. Bell, Mrs. M. H. Wilson, and Mrs. I. **Gift of Ice and Fish.**—The grateful thanks of the Committee are hereby tendered to Messrs. Humble and Sons for their unlimited supply of ice throughout the year free; also for the use of their cool chambers on various occasions gratis. These gentlemen have given free ice for six consecutive years.

To the Queenscliff Fishermen your Committee also conveys its sincere thanks for frequent donations of fish, received through Mr. Tobias, which were much appreciated.

**Votes of Thanks** are hereby tendered to the Ladies' Flower Mission, for supplying cut flowers weekly throughout the year, and to all those societies or individuals who have given or promoted Concerts or Entertainments in aid or for the amusement of patients and inmates, or who have in any way assisted the Institution. To the Press sincere thanks are offered for the manner in which it has at all times assisted and advocated the requirements of the Institution financially; also the proprietors of the following papers:—*Australasian*, *Argus*, *Age*, *Leader*, *Geelong Advertiser*, *Geelong Times*, *Ballarat Star*, *Ballarat Courier*, and *Advocate*, for the gratuitous supply of their papers, which are much appreciated.

It is impossible to place a value on the great amount of gratuitous services rendered to the Institution and patients generally by kind hearted and generous men and women. It is also extremely difficult for the Committee to adequately express their gratitude to these unselfish workers in the noble work of charity. For the many and liberal donations of all descriptions received the Committee desire to express sincere thanks.

**The Xmas. Dinner** was a great success, there being everything that the heart of man or woman either could desire. It was entirely due to the kindly liberality of the residents of Geelong and District that this was so, and they are all heartily thanked. A list of those who subscribed, in money or kind, is given elsewhere.

**Board of Management.**—Geo. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President by the Subscribers at the last Annual Meeting, J. Nicol, Esq. and C. Shannon, Esq., Vice-Presidents, and J. W. Sayer, Esq., Hon. Treasurer. Mr. J. H. Peebles, who was elected in 1901, died, much regretted by all. He took an active interest in the Hospital and its work, and he will be missed. A paragraph recording his services was placed upon *Minute Book*, and letter of condolence forwarded to his family by your Committee. Mr. Philpot was subsequently elected by the Managers to fill his seat. After many years active interest Mr. W. Gardiner has retired, having earned the highest opinion and best thanks of the Committee for consistent and faithful service. In accordance with the Bye-Laws Mr. E. Philpot now goes out, but is eligible for re-election. The following gentlemen also retire, viz.:—Messrs. W. W. Bradley, W. Humble, J. Purdie, and J. Munday. Having been longest in office they are all eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly. These names, with Mr. Gardiner's vacant seat, make the statutory six.

**The Honorary Medical Staff** consists of Drs. Newman, Marwood, Kennedy, and McCallum, with Drs. Croker and Small as Honorary Consulting Surgeons. The first four now retire, but are eligible for re-election. On behalf of the Subscribers, the thanks of the Committee are tendered to these gentlemen for their kind attention to the patients during the year.

**Committees.**—During the year 14 meetings of the General Committee of Management, 53 of the House Committee, and 12 of the Finance Committee have been held. The thanks of the Subscribers are due to the members of these Committees for the careful way in which they have looked after the interests of the Institution.

**In conclusion**, the Committee of Management would urge the necessity upon the public of continued and increased support, if the Institution is to advance with the times.

Modern surgery especially requires a continuous expenditure on dressings and instruments. This of course entails a large outlay, which can only be made with the generous help of the charitable.

# Extracts from Bye-Laws.

## Objects.

Bye-Law No 2.—That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; to a limited number of paying patients whose admission, under special circumstances, may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the objects of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

## Appropriation of Buildings.

Bye-Law No. 3.—That a portion of one of the buildings shall be set apart for the purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of a Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatics on remand for medical examination in a ward erected for that purpose.

## Constitution.

Bye-Law No. 4.—The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

## Qualification, Designation, and Privileges of Benefactors.

Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors and Honorary Collectors, viz. :—

Provided always that no Minister, Congregation, Association, Society, Company or Person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

- Bye-Law No. 6.—Life Governors will be entitled to recommend—
- 1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books).
- Life Subscriber—
- 1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually.
- Governor for 1 Year—
- 10 In and 20 Out-Patients.
- Contributor—
- 1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 subscribed.
- Honorary Collector—
- 1 In and 2 Out-Patients annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law No. 7.—Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and *vice versa*, one In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes ; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes ; Annual Contributors of £5 5s. and upwards, three votes ; £3 3s., two votes ; £1, one vote ; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

*Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.*

Bye-Law No. 58.—Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more, an In-Patient's ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients, in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon ; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

*Admission of Paying Patients.*

Bye-Law No. 59.—Paying Patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each Patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance ; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a Paying Patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.—The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all Paying Patients.

*Persons not Admissible.*

Bye-Law No. 61.—No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement ; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward ; no one having a contagious or infectious disease ; no one subject to epilepsy ; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an Out-Patient, shall be admitted ; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accidents or for a surgical operation ; nor except under special circumstances shall Patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist ; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next General Meeting of the Committee of Management.

*Admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum.*

Bye-Law No. 62.—The admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement ; no person insane ; no child under twelve years of age ; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

*Payment of Maintenance.*

All Patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them ; and all property found on Patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a Sub-Committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any Patient in case of his refusal to pay ; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) Patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
