FIFTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT of the General Committee of Management.

THE Board of Managers of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum have the honor to submit for the information of the Governors, Subscribers, and the general public their Fifty-seventh Annual Report of the condition and progress of the Institution for the year ending 30th June, 1909, together with the audited Balance Sheet, and a synopsis of the Finances.

The year has been a busy one all round, both the medical and surgical wards having been nearly full all the time, in addition to the Infectious Wards, which have amply justified the expense of building.

Typhoid fever was not very prevalent, only 36 patients being admitted.

The total number of patients passing through the Institution was 2,004. Of these 1,036 were admitted to the wards.

Out-Door Patients.—Number admitted—Males, 485; Females, 483. Total, 968. Number of occasions on which they attended, 5,134.

The average Rate of Mortality has been 10.3 for all cases, 7.7 for Hospital In-Door Patients. Ten deaths occurred within twenty-four hours of admission, which were hopeless from the first. The total number remaining in the Institution on the 30th June, 1909, was 132.

Infectious Wards.—These have never been empty during the last twelve months, and have amply justified their being built. Seventy-four cases of Diphtheria have been admitted, and 2 of Scarlet Fever. It speaks well for the treatment, when we are able to report that no deaths occurred. Forty-nine were received from Geelong, 11 from Belmont, 4 West Geelong, and the remainder from Chilwell and Newtown. There are remaining at present, and under treatment, 7 cases.

Thirty-six Typhoids were also admitted to the general wards, as owing to the Infectious Hospital being occupied with so many Diphtheria patients, it was impossible to treat them there, and although the Central Board of Health considers that Typhoids should be kept away from other non-infectious diseases, it was not possible to do so. One nurse contracted the disease and was away for some months. One also caught Diphtheria.

Maternity Wards.—It is proposed by your Committee to go into the question of whether it is advisable to utilise some portion of the present Hospital for Maternity Wards for the reception of urgent and suitable cases. Probably something definite will be done in this direction during the coming year. One of the most likely proposals being, to turn six of the nurses' bedrooms, in the main building, into lying-in rooms, and to erect a like number of new bedrooms at or adjoining the present Nurses' Home. This would enable all the nurses to sleep away from the Hospital, and be very beneficial for them in many ways. Resolutions will be submitted at the forthcoming Annual Meeting to empower the Committee to carry out this proposal. It is probable that an effort will shortly be made to raise the money to do so. The cost would be about £800, and we feel sure that the many wealthy residents of the town and district will help for such an estimable object.

The amount to credit of Endowment Fund is £5,167 2s. 6d., and of the Reserve Fund, £4,049 10s. The Endowment Fund has been increased by further instalments from the Estate of the late Mr. J. Thompson, of Keilambete, amounting to £807 7s. The Reserve Fund is augmented by £500, being sundry bequests during the year; together with £100, part endowment of the Commu Na Feinne Bed. The Government Grant was £2,500.

Visitors' Monthly Report.—Two members of the General Committee have, each month, been appointed during the year, to inspect the Institution. Their visits were made at unexpected times. The reports received from them were always of a satisfactory nature, and call for no comment.

Financial and General.—The revenue for the past year has been well maintained.

Included in the payments received, on account of patients, is the sum of £229 2s. 6d., which various Councils or patients have paid on account of their residents treated in the Infectious Wards.

The daily average has been 144 occupied beds, which is less than last year. But the reduction in numbers has occurred on the Benevolent Asylum side, the Hospital patients being slightly more. The average cost per bed was £38 9s. 9d., which is £6 more than last year. It is principally accounted for by the extra cost of working the Infectious Wards, which has necessitated an increase in the Nursing Staff of six. These wards, while very necessary, are also a considerable extra expense to work. It must be remembered, however, that the Institution is paid either by the Councils, or the patients £2 per week per case. This is an extremely reasonable charge for these patients—£2 9s. is what the Melbourne Infectious Wards receive. Among other causes that have helped to swell the average cost are increased price of milk, and a rather large increase occurs under the headings—bedding, clothing, &c. drugs, disinfectants and dressings, and Nurses' salaries. These all show a marked advance, and have militated against our credit balance at the bank. The receipts for maintenance were £5,673, and the expenses of maintenance £5,544. The income, therefore, was just sufficient to keep us out of debt.

A proposal is also to be brought before the Annual Meeting of Subscribers, to give contributors of 10s. or upwards, the privilege of having Two Out-Patients' tickets annually. At present they do not get anything.

The Institution is being kept thoroughly up-to-date with regard to its work, and patients frequently seek admission from other centres, giving us their reason that they hear such good reports of the treatment received here, &c. As a training-school also it bears a good name, eager candidates for admission to the school coming from all parts of Victoria.

The building itself is very old, and costly to keep in repair; nevertheless, the results obtained, both on the surgical and medical side, are quite on a par with more modern Hospitals. Sooner or later the question of re-building will have to be squarely faced; but the time is not yet.

Hospital Saturday and Sunday.—£366 10s. 8d. was collected, which your Committee regrets shows a falling off of £30 on the previous year's receipts. It is sincerely hoped that the leeway will be made up this year. Included in the above is an amount of £32, collected in the town on Saturday by Nurses, Mrs. M. Bean, and the Salvation Army. To all these ladies your Committee's thanks are conveyed. Messrs. Dennys, Lascelles, Austin & Co., Dalgety & Co., T. Everett and T. Bostock lent their motor cars and chauffeurs on the occasion to convey the collectors to their several rendezvous. They are hereby sincerely thanked for their kindness. A special effort was made to enlist the assistance of some of the ladies of the town to help our nurse collectors, and a public meeting was called by advertisement. It is with regret we have to report that only two ladies offered their services.

Entertainments in Aid.—Nothing has been received under this heading during the past twelve months. It is hoped that more interest will be shown by the many talented amateurs in the town and district during the coming year. The aid received in this direction is very weak.

Special donations have been received from the Edward Wilson *Argus* Fund, £50; Felton Bequest Committee, £95; Australian Natives' Conference (Geelong), £10 10s.; Collection, Farmers' Convention, July 1908, £7 2s 8d.

Bequests.—The following have been received from the Estates of deceased benefactors:—Estate late Mr. J. J. Burns, £25; Estate late Mr. T. Peters, £100; Estate late Mr. E. R. Morris, £53 3s.; Estate late Mrs. A. Watson, £50; Estate late Col. J. L. Price, £50; Estate late Mrs. M. Cochand, £10.

Your Committee is extremely thankful and obliged to the trustees and donors for their continued help.

Nurses' Training School.—The following changes have taken place in the personnel of the Nurses' Staff. Nurses L. Hill and A. Tapp have been promoted to the positions of Ward Sister; Z. Parry and M. Anderson gained their certificates and left the Hospital. At the recent Melbourne examinations, Nurses I. Mockridge and R. Parry were successful candidates. Nurses Davies, Arnold, Seward, Hogg, Moore and Thomas passed in anatomy and physiology. Owing to the number of patients admitted to the Infectious Wards, our Nursing Staff has had to be increased considerably, and, in consequence, our accommodation has been severely taxed. Their sittingroom has had to be converted into a bedroom. There is urgent need for additional sleeping accommodation at the Harding Home.

Operating Theatre.—Two hundred and nineteen operations have been performed during the year, which is thirty-five more than last year; in this department the new operating table has proved a great boon.

Life Subscribers and Governors.—Mr. J. Stokes, Yarra Street, Geelong, was elected a Life Subscriber on the nomination of the Geelong Artillery Band; Dr. P. A. Croker, Ryrie Street, was elected a Governor for five years, as the first-named Executor of Miss M. A. Watson (deceased); as also was Mr. J. Howard, of Little Ryrie Street, first-named Executor of will of Mr. T. Peters (deceased).

Staff.—Dr. G. R. Darby resigned in December. Your Committee much regretted losing his services. Dr. H. Downing was appointed in his stead. In September, Mr. Chas. Eynon, Dispenser, resigned, and Mr. S. Molloy was given the appointment. They are both giving satisfaction to your Committee in the performance of their duties. No other changes have occurred.

Medical Staff.—Drs. A. W. Marwood, F. J. Newman, T. J. M. Kennedy, and G. McCallum, were re-elected by the Subscribers at the last election; with Drs. R. McPhee and H. F. Elvins as Hon. Anaesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively. Drs. J. Small and P. Croker continue to act as Hon. Consulting Officers. Your Committee's thanks are tendered to all these gentlemen for their valuable assistance. With the exception of Drs. Small and Croker they now retire, but are willing to be re-elected and offer themselves accordingly.

Gifts.—Your Committee's grateful and sincere thanks are conveyed to the following kind benefactors:—Messrs. W. Humble & Sons, supply of ice throughout the year, and use of cool storage at Christmas; Queenscliff Fishing Company and Fishermen, numerous donations of fish. To the Ladies' Flower Mission for supply of cut flowers throughout the year. To the Press for the valuable and gratuitous help it has freely given. To the proprietors of the *Australasian*, *Argus*, *Age*, *Leader*, *Weekly Times*, *Geelong Advertiser*, *Geelong Times*, *Bullarat Star* and *Courier*, *Southern Cross*, *Advocate* and *Worker* for supplying their respective papers.

It is not possible to place a value on the amount of gratuitous services rendered to the Institution and patients generally by kind-hearted men and women. It is also difficult for the Committee to adequately express their gratitude to these unselfish workers in the work of charity. For the many and liberal donations of all descriptions received, the Committee desire to express sincere thanks.

Christmas Dinner.—Messrs. J. Nicol, F. J. Leary, T. A. Dickson, E. L. Jullien, and the Secretary, volunteered to canvass the town for donations to the Christmas dinner, which they did, with very gratifying results. The repast set before the patients and inmates was quite up to any of its predecessors, and was thoroughly enjoyed by those who partook of it. A liberal supply of tobacco and cigars had also been provided by a few generous townsmen, and these were much appreciated by the many smokers. All who contributed are hereby gratefully thanked. Elsewhere is published a list of the kind donors.

A pleasing feature of the work has been the receipt of letters and oral testimony from patients and their friends, expressing gratitude for kindness and treatment received from officers, nurses, and staff.

Board of Management.—Geo. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President at the last Annual Meeting; C. Shannon, Esq., and J. Nicol, Esq., Vice-Presidents; J. Smith, Esq., Hon. Treasurer. The Rev. Hy. Kelly, owing to his removal to Melbourne, resigned in December last; his departure was much regretted by your Committee. The Rev. F. J. Newton was elected to fill his place. Mr. T. A. Dickson was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr. J. W. Sayer. In accordance with the Bye-laws the Rev. F. J. Newton and Mr. T. A. Dickson now retire, but they are willing to be re-elected. The following members of the Committee also go out by effluxion of time, having been longest in office:—Messrs. H. B. Brown, G. E. England, E. L. Jullien, W. C. Kernot. These make the statutory six. They are all eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

During the year Twelve meetings of the General Committee; Fifty-two of the House Committee; Twelve of the Finance; and Three Special meetings have been held.

Your Committee, in closing this report, would venture to draw the attention of the public to the important work done by this combined Institution in alleviating human distress and suffering, and in checking the spread of disease. With a daily average of one hundred and forty-four inmates and patients, and a staff of fifty to pay and provide for, a large sum of money has to be found yearly, so that while returning sincere thanks to those who have in any way assisted in the past, we cannot too strongly urge the necessity for a continued and increased support.

Extracts From Bye-Laws.

Qualification, Designation, and Privileges of Benefactors.—Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors, and Honorary Collectors, viz.:—£50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor; £30 personal contribution in one year—Governor for 5 years, with privileges during that period of a Life Governor; £20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber; £50 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will—Governor for 5 years, to be entitled to 4 In and 8 Out Patients annually; £25 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor under such will—Governor for 2 years, to be entitled to 2 In and 4 Out Patients' tickets annually; £20 Society, Association, or Company collecting or paying in one year (to nominate for each £20 collected or paid)—Life Subscriber; £1 and upwards, Minister of Church or Layman collecting in one year—Honorary Collector; £1 and upwards, yearly subscription—Contributor.

Provided always that no Minister, Congregation, Association, Society, Company, or person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6.—Life Governors will be entitled to recommend 1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books); Governor for 5 years (personal donation)—1 In and 4 Out-Patients always on the books during that time; Governor for 5 years (Executor under will)—4 In and 8 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Governor for 2 years—2 In and 4 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Life Subscriber—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Contributor—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 subscribed; Honorary Collector—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-law No. 7.—Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such person shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and the accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to the Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and *vice-versa*; One In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5/- and upwards, three votes; £3 3/-, two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.—Bye-Law No. 58.—Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more, an In-Patient's Ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients in ordinary cases recommended by subscribers' Tickets shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary, and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

Admission of Paying Patients.—Bye-Law No. 59.—Paying Patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate, to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a Paying Patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.—The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all Paying Patients.

Persons not Admissible.—Bye-Law No. 61.—No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor anyone who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an Out-Patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accident or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall Patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

Admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum.—Bye-Law No. 62.—The admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets; when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

Payment of Maintenance.—All Patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on Patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a Sub-Committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any Patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) Patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
