FIFTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT of the Committee of Management.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.—

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.—

IN presenting to you their Fifty-Ninth Report, your Committee has to admit with regret that the Institution is financially worse off at the end of the year than it was at the beginning. On July 1st, 1910, the amount to credit of Current Account was £496 9s. 6d. On 30th June 1911, it was £367 s. 7d., which means a deficiency of £160. This is accounted for principally by £368 which was expended on New Buildings, £300 of which was the balance owing on additions to Nurses' quarters.

Although the daily average of Patients has been slightly less than last year, the items Eggs, £13; Milk, £124; Fish, £120; show an increase of from 25 to 50 per cent. for the current term. This has been caused principally by the extra quantities of these articles ordered as comforts. In no former Balance Sheet have these totals been equalled.

Provisions have also been somewhat higher in price, owing to recent legislation.

The Revenue remains practically stationary whilst our Expenditure increases. At the same time the people who give liberally to Charity are the ones whose means are being curtailed through the same causes, and there is no sign of any improvement in this direction.

In addition to this, it has been found necessary to further increase the permanent Nursing Staff; and to employ three more Wardsmaids.

The Dietary of the Staff has also been improved and augmented (which has been considered necessary), as the standard of living has advanced during recent years; it is nevertheless a factor in increasing the cost of Maintenance.

The extra expenditure entailed in treating surgical cases nowadays also helps to swell the bill.

The gradual reduction of the Government Grant from £3450 in 1899 to £2450 in 1911 has always to be kept in view when financial questions are considered, and it is gratifying to be able to say that your Institution is one of the few in the State that has, until the present year, been able to keep its head above water without falling back into debt. We have every confidence that our subscribers will help to keep the finances sound and straight.

While on the subject of Finance your Committee might say that when they decided to enlarge and furnish the Training Nurses' Home at a cost of £1000, they had great hopes that some of the wealthy and charitable residents of the District would come to the rescue with help. In this they have been disappointed. No special assistance has been received, and the whole cost has had to be debited to the current Maintenance Account. It was reported recently in the daily press that Mr. C. L. Forrest, M.L.A., when he heard that Colac Hospital required an Operating Theatre, and had not the money to obtain it, gave them £850 to build one.

These are the men who originally made the Hospitals of Victoria possible. May we express the hope that there are others like Mr. Forrest, who only need to know our position to come forward and do likewise.

The total number of patients passing through the Institution was 2614. Of these 1158 were admitted to the Wards.

Out-Door Patients.—Number admitted: Males, 916; Females, 510; Total, 1456. Number of occasions on which they attended, 6595.

Infectious Diseases.—133 Patients were admitted. They comprised 55 cases of Typhoid, 64 cases of Diphtheria, 6 Scarlet Fever and 6 Measles. One death occurred from Typhoid, and two from Diphtheria.

Of these patients, Geelong sent 64; Newtown and Chilwell, 35; Geelong West, 17; Shire of Corio, 5; Shire of Bellarine, 5; Shire of South Barwon, 3; Shire of Meredith, 2; Shire of Bannockburn, 2.

Diphtheria in recent years seems to have become almost endemic in Geelong, as the Wards have never been unoccupied, except for a day or two since they were opened.

The Average Rate of Mortality has been 7.3 for all cases; 6.3 for Hospital In-Door Patients. Four deaths occurred within twenty-four hours of admission.

The Amount to Credit of Endowment Fund is £7,685 2s. 6d.; and of the Reserve Fund, £4,250 2s. 8d.

Visitors' Monthly Reports.—Regularly every month during the year two members of the General Committee have made a careful inspection of the Institution. Their reports were always satisfactory, and call for no comment.

Geelong West Borough Council and Infectious Cases.—The dispute between this Council and your Board of Management as to what amount was an equitable payment annually for their Infectious Cases was brought to a close by the Central Board of Health adjudicating and fixing the sum at £75.

Operating Theatre.—This is ever an expensive department of the Hospital to maintain, as with the constant wear and sterilizing, instruments are always having to be renewed. During the year under review Instruments cost £106. A thoroughly up-to-date steam sterilizing plant has also just been procured, which will cost £90. It is not yet paid for. Might we bring this before any charitable subscriber who may wish to signalize any stroke of fortune he has possibly been blessed with. The presentation of this expensive item to the Hospital would be a splendid way of commemorating it. In the Theatre 261 operations have been performed with fairly well marked success. The Operating Theatre is now as well equipped in instruments, etc., as any country Hospital in the State. There has been a considerable number of operations performed on women, showing that there is no need for them to go and obtain treatment at special hospitals.

The Daily Average of Occupied Beds has been 63.2 Hospital, and 80.7 Benevolent Asylum. The average cost per bed was £43, which is £3 more than last year. The reasons for this have been detailed earlier in the report.

Hospital Saturday and Sunday.—£465 was collected; £327 2s. 8d. was the actual amount given to the Hospital by the Churches from their collections on Hospital Sunday, a certain proportion being allocated to the Ladies' Benevolent Society by the City Churches. Your Committee has for years urged the Churches to give their Hospital Sunday Collections wholly to the Hospital, instead of sharing it between the Ladies' Benevolent Society and the Hospital. We hold that it is a fund intended to help the Medical Charities solely, and should not be used for other non-medical charities, however deserving they may be. The Committee therefore would again appeal to the several Church authorities of Geelong, asking them to make this year's collection a Hospital one in fact as well as in name. Included in the above amount of £465 is £75 which was collected by the Nurses of the Institution and several other unselfish workers in the streets. Their zeal and kindness were rewarded by a record Saturday Collection. Misses Stacia Massey and Marie Degenhardt, with Master Mederic Fraillon and his sister, did splendidly. The Salvation Army and Wharf Laborers' Union also generously assisted. To the Nurses and these kind Honorary Collectors, your Committee's sincere thanks are now conveyed. Messrs. Dalgety & Co. (through D. Aitken, Esq.), J. C. Brown & Co. and S. R. J. Mawson, Esq. most generously lent their Motor Cars with services of Chauffeurs for the day. They are hereby gratefully thanked.

It was recently suggested by a prominent citizen that Steam Radiators for heating purposes would be far cleaner, warmer, and more up-to-date for the Institution than the old-fashioned wood and coal fires in use. The suggestion is undoubtedly good, and it is only a question of money that

stands in the way. Given that, the Radiators could be introduced at once if it was decided they were desirable. An unknown donor was some time ago said to be anxious to give £200 to provide something in the direction of improved heating appliances. Here is a fine opportunity for him to gratify his generous impulse, and we therefore commend it to his notice. It is estimated that it would cost fully £800 to instal the necessary plant.

The help these generous benefactors have provided is much esteemed.

Old Age Pensions.—The consideration of the diversion of the pension paid by the Commonwealth to persons receiving same under the Act and receiving treatment at this Institution at the same time, demands consideration. We maintain and treat patients of this class, and in many cases have also to bury them, but no part of the pension is ever allowed by the Pension Authorities to be paid to us towards the expenses incurred. It has often happened that pensioners have been brought in practically in extremis, and died a few hours afterwards. The Hospital has had to bury them. We are of the opinion that the pension should be paid to our funds during the time pensioners are inmates; and hope that in future legislation will be introduced to remedy this state of things.

Municipal Contributions.—The following is extracted from the Inspector of Charities' Report to the Honorable the Treasurer on his last inspection:—"The Municipal Grant to this Institution is very poor. Hamilton, with a daily average of 41 beds, obtains £420 from the Municipalities; Geelong's daily average is 102.7, and the Municipal Grant is £410, the greater part of which is in payment for Municipal Infectious Cases. The Municipal Grant should be about double what it is."

It may be desirable to again mention that the Treasury makes no Government Allowance for any Infectious Cases treated in the Infectious Wards, so that the upkeep is thrown entirely upon this Institution.

Entertainments in Aid.—£29 1s. represents the total receipts from this source, and is a very insignificant sum considering the district to which the Institution can lay claim to support.

Would it not be possible for some of our ladies and townsmen to organize some entertainment or bazaar to pay off the debt incurred when building additions to Nurses' Wards, which absorbed £1000 from the Maintenance Account?

To show what can be done, Mrs. G. E. England, of Newtown, was told last year of our long-felt want of a new piano for the Old Folks' Concerts. She promptly decided that we should have a new one, and without further delay purchased an instrument for £10. Alone she then organized two concerts, which cleared her of all liability and left £5 in hand, which Mrs. England expended in Clothing for the Infirm.

Your Committee's hearty thanks are hereby conveyed to her, together with all who have in any way assisted at these and other Concerts.

Medical Staff.—Drs. A. W. Marwood, F. J. Newman, T. J. M. Kennedy and G. McCallum were re-elected by the electors at last elections, with Drs. R. G. McPhee and H. F. Elvins as Hon. Anaesthetist and Hon. Skiagraphist respectively. Drs. McPhee and Elvins also take Out-Patients four days in each week. Drs. J. Small and P. A. Croker continue on the Staff as Hon. Consulting Officers. Sincere thanks are conveyed to these gentlemen for their valued services. With the exception of Drs. Small and Croker, they now retire, but are willing to be re-elected, and offer themselves accordingly.

Thanks are hereby tendered to all who have in any way assisted either to amuse or support the infirm and sick. Mrs. Bromley is also tendered thanks for obtaining members of the Domestic Staff free.

Christmas Dinner.—Messrs. J. Nicol (Vice-President), W. C. Kernot, A. Collier, F. J. Leary and W. Higgins agreed to collect for donations to the Christmas Dinner, which they carried out successfully with the Secretary. The usual generous repast was provided, and done ample justice to. Cigars and plenty of Tobacco for the smokers (which included nearly every man present), with good brown ale, the gift of generous townsmen, were fully enjoyed. To the generous donors sincere thanks are conveyed.

Board of Management.—G. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President at the last Annual Meeting; J. Nicol, Esq., and Dr. J. Small, Vice-Presidents; J. Smith, Esq., Hon. Treasurer; Messrs. C. Shannon, E. Philpott, A. Collier, F. J. Leary, J. P. McCabe Doyle and the Rev. A. Powell were re-elected as Members of the General Committee. In April, the Hon. Treasurer, Mr. J. Smith, resigned, owing to his removal from Geelong; the Rev. A. Powell also vacated his seat on the Board for a like reason. It was with great regret that your Committee received the resignations of these two gentlemen. Both gave their valuable time generously to the service of conducting the Institution, and their matured counsels will be missed in Committee. Your Board wishes them long life and prosperity in their new spheres. A. W. Butt, Esq., and the Rev. R. Kelly were elected by the General Committee to the vacancies thus created until the end of the financial year. These gentlemen then come before the Subscribers for election in the usual way. In addition, the following Members of Committee now go out by effluxion of time in accordance with the Rules, but are all eligible and willing to be re-elected, and offer themselves accordingly, viz.—Messrs. W. Higgins, J. Purdie, W. W. Bradley, W. Humble, and Rev. E. Harris.

In conclusion, the Committee offer their best thanks to all who have by subscription, donation or other means assisted to maintain the Institution. They feel it incumbent upon them, however, to say that in order that the work shall be carried on as it should be, it is hoped additional financial aid will be forthcoming, either from the Government or the generous public during the coming year.

During the year 12 Meetings of the General Committee, 31 of the House Committee, 12 of the Finance Committee, and 3 Special Meetings have been held.

Extracts from Bye-Laws.

Qualification, Designation, and Privileges of Benefactors.—Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors, and Honorary Collectors, viz.:—£50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor; £30 personal contribution in one year—Governor for 5 years, with privileges during that period of a Life Governor; £20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber; £50 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will—Governor for 5 years, to be entitled to 4 In and 8 Out Patients annually; £25 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor under such will—Governor for two years, to be entitled to 2 In and 4 Out Patients' tickets annually; £20 Society, Association or Company collecting or paying in one year (to nominate for each £20 collected or paid)—Life Subscriber; £1 and upwards, Minister of Church or Layman collecting in one year—Honorary Collector; £1 and upwards, yearly subscription—Contributor.

Provided always that no Minister, Congregation, Association, Society, Company, or person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves, to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every public or corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6—Life Governors will be entitled to recommend 1 In and 4 Out-Patients always on the books; Governor for 5 years (personal donation)—1 In and 4 Out-Patients always on the books during that time; Governor for 5 years (Executor under will)—1 In and 8 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Governor for 2 years—2 In and 4 Out-Patients' Tickets annually; Life Subscriber—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' Tickets annually; Contributor—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' Tickets annually for each £1 subscribed; Honorary Collector—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law No. 7.—Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such person shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and the accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to the Subscribers at the time of payment of Subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients and "vice-versa"; One In-Patient's Ticket being equivalent to three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5/- and upwards, three votes; £3 3/-, two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors, for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.—Bye-Law No. 58.—Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more, an In-Patient's Ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' Tickets shall be daily (Sundays excepted), between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary, and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

Admission of Paying Patients.—Bye-Law No. 59.—Paying Patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who ~~shall fix the weekly rate~~ to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary, may fix a fee therefor, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a Paying Patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.—The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all Paying Patients.

Persons not Admissible.—Bye-Law No. 61.—No insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor anyone who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an Out-Patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accident or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall Patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

Admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum.—Bye-Law No. 62.—The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets; when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

Payment of Maintenance.—All Patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on Patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a Sub-Committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any Patient, in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary), Patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
