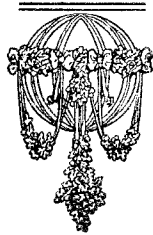

Sixty-Third Annual Report of the Committee of Management *June 1915*

The Committee of Management have the honour to submit to the Subscribers their Sixty-Third Annual Report and Balance Sheet, for the year ending June 30th, 1915.

The Committee regrets to report that the financial position is very grave, as the account for maintenance for the past year exceeds the whole income (which includes £505 bequests) by £804. Together with the accumulated deficiency of £1200, taken from the reserve fund two years ago, the total shortage amounts to £2004. This large deficit is principally caused through the marked increase of all articles of food, drugs, wages, and running the Infectious Wards at a loss, etc. Nor is the maximum expenditure yet reached. The income considering the many heavy calls on the public has not shown any great falling off. The items of income which show a decrease are—Municipal Grants. Proceeds of Entertainments and a slight decrease in Hospital Sunday Fund. Bequests also suffer by comparison with other years, the amount of legacies received being £505, against £1053 for 1914. The Maintenance Account shows a large increase of over £1000 during the past year, being £8022, against £7035 for the preceding year. No new buildings have been erected, and the only money spent on repairs has been absolutely necessary.

The situation shown by these figures is very serious, as the Institution has only been carrying on by living on its Reserve Fund, which had been built up in the past towards the erection of a new hospital. This fund will shortly be exhausted, and unless increased help comes it will be impossible to carry on the Institution; for it is plain to all that a charity, spending approximately £800 a year more than its income, cannot long continue to do so.

Hospital Sunday Fund returned £630/3/-, against £655/14/2 for the previous year, and £640 the year before that.

Municipal Grants amount to only £67/15/-, which is just about half what was received for the previous year. It is hoped that the Municipalities will increase their donations.

The Infectious Wards have been painted and renovated throughout, at a cost of a little over £100, which was paid for by the Councils. The Councils have also erected a large tent, to take the overflow from the main wards.

The total number of patients passing through the Institution was 2594: of these 1400 were admitted to the Wards.

Out-Door and Casualty Patients.—Out-door: Number admitted, Males 701; Females 493. Casualties, 544. Total, 1194. Number of occasions on which they were attended, 5272.

Infectious Diseases.—192 patients were treated. Diphtheria, 149; Typhoid, 18; Phthisis, 14; Scarlet Fever, 4; Measles, 7. Two deaths occurred from Diphtheria, two from Typhoid Fever, and one from Scarlet Fever.

Rate of mortality has been 7.10 for all cases; 6.7 for Hospital In-door patients. Thirteen deaths occurred within 24 hours of admission.

Operating Theatre.—271 operations have been performed.

The daily average of occupied beds has been 136: Hospital 66, Infectious Wards 9, and Benevolent Asylum 70. The average cost per bed, on the Government basis of two Benevolents to one In-patient, was £79/5/11½. This is £6/15/5½ more per bed than last year, and is caused by increased cost of food, labour, etc., as above stated.

Hospital Sunday.—Notwithstanding the prominence given by the Press to this movement, considerable difficulty was experienced in getting lady collectors. Those who did volunteer, however, made up for those who did not come forward, by working with great energy throughout the day, as did our own nurses. The street collections amounted to £196/4/4—£33/18/- coming from Newtown and Chilwell, and £39/3/9 from Geelong West District. Since this collection was taken up, astonishing amounts have been collected for the Belgian and other War Funds, and it is sincerely hoped that the ladies of Geelong will give their energies in a like manner at our next Hospital Saturday Collections.

Entertainments.—Only £73/17/6 was raised, and while your Committee do not for one moment grudge what is being done for the Belgian and Red Cross Funds, but much admire the self-sacrifice that is being shown, they would at the same time very insistently point out that the sick and poor are as numerous as in former years, and there is a tendency for the local charitable institutions to suffer at the expense of what is being done for those in other lands.

Egg Collection.—The Editor of the "Geelong Advertiser" again kindly organised an Egg collection, and 18,000 dozen eggs approximately were received and preserved. Editor, collectors, and donors, are hereby gratefully thanked for their kind help; also the head teachers who gave great assistance to the movement.

Medical Staff.—Drs. F. J. Newman, A. W. Marwood, T. J. M. Kennedy, and G. McCallum, were re-elected by the Subscribers, with Drs. R. G. McPhee and H. T. Elvins, as Hon. Anaesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively. Dr. B. C. Joel was appointed Hon. Oculist, and Dr. J. E. Piper Hon. Pathologist. The Subscribers' thanks are due to these gentlemen for their generous services in the cause of the poor.

Attention has been often drawn to the age of the present buildings. Your Committee is now faced with an expenditure of about £2000 to sewer the whole area. This is a tremendous financial problem, and your Committee does not well see how the amount can be much reduced. The Benevolent Asylum being attached to the Hospital makes it very scattered, expensive, and hard to work. Mr. Humble, some years ago, tried to get part of the Haines' Bequest towards transferring the Benevolent Asylum to some other site, but was not successful. The Committee fully realise the dilapidated condition of many parts of the building, the erection of which was started some time about 1848. At the same time, the Committee would draw the attention of the Subscribers to the fact that the results obtained here, both in medical and surgical wards, compare favourably with the most up-to-date hospitals in Australia; and while the present financial position is what it is, the Committee would recommend the Subscribers to continue with the old building, unless some benevolent donor comes along with a large sum towards the erection of a new Hospital; in which case the Committee would be only too thankful and willing to go straight ahead with the new building.

Gifts.—The following are gratefully thanked:—Ladies' Flower Mission, the Press and Proprietors of the Advertiser, Times, Argus, Age, Leader, Australasian, and Worker, for supplying their respective papers. Thanks are also tendered to all who have in any way assisted.

Grateful thanks are also tendered to those who so generously provided the usual Christmas dinner, with plenty of tobacco and cigars for patients and inmates. The dinner was done full justice to by all who could participate of it.

Reserve and Endowment Funds.—The amount to the credit of the Reserve Fund is £3260/10/9, and the bank overdraft for the moment is extinguished by the further transfer of £400 from Reserve Account to Current Account. At the present rate of spending, the balance of this fund will be expended in maintenance before two years have expired. The Endowment Fund account amounts to £7685/2/6. This money was left by the late Mr. John Thompson, of "Kilambete," as an endowment fund in perpetuity, the interest only to be available for maintenance. On more than one occasion the Government has threatened to bring in a Bill making it legal to use Bequests left in this way, for either building or maintenance. Your Committee hold that such a proceeding would be entirely wrong, and a breach of faith with the generous donors who bequeathed their money for Endowment purposes. Moreover, it would also undoubtedly prevent people now alive, from leaving money as an endowment to Charitable Institutions, if they saw it was liable to be upset by the Government of the day. Furthermore, directly the Endowment Fund is spent, we lose an income of nearly £300 a year. So that the extinguishing of this money would be the equivalent to a loss of 300 annual subscribers at £1 each.

Nursing Department.—During the year, twelve nurses presented themselves for the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A., 11 of whom passed successfully. Fourteen pupil nurses entered as vacancies occurred, and were accepted for training. The death of Nurse Edith Grant, which took place on December 22nd, 1914, was deeply regretted. She was deservedly esteemed by all with whom she came in contact.

Governors.—Mr. W. H. Thomas, executor late A. Miller's bequest, elected governor for 5 years, July 8th, 1914. Mr. C. L. Andrews, deceased, donation, £20.

Consumptive Patients.—Your Committee again urges that in every district the Government should erect sanatoria for the early diagnosis and proper nursing of consumptive cases. Many of these patients are treated in the general hospitals of the State, often lingering for months at a time and actually come here after being discharged from a recognised Government sanatorium, having been turned adrift, helpless, on the community in the most dangerously infectious stage of their complaint. The sanatoria, if for curing, only wants early cases, which is the time when treatment is most hopeful, the latter patients require an incurable hospital for their reception, when diagnosed as incurable.

Infectious Wards.—The basis of the Board of Health's award for payment by municipalities of £60 per occupied bed, per annum, has proved totally inadequate to pay the expenses of the patients, and helps to deplete the general hospital funds. Your Committee, several years ago, asked for 35/- per week per patient, and still hold that this would be a fair and reasonable payment. They have recently again approached the Board to ask them to re-consider their verdict, which was made some years ago, when the price of everything was much lower. The Board has replied that the Minister sees no reason to review its previous scale of charges. The Municipal Councils have all along behaved in the most amicable and reasonable way.

The actual cost of treating patients during the past year, on the basis of 35/- per week, amounts to £841/15/-, towards which, under the Board's award, at 22/6 per week, the councils contribute only £540, leaving a deficit of £302.

Committee.—At the last annual meeting, Mr. G. Martin, J.P., was re-elected President; Dr. J. Small and Mr. J. Nicol, Vice-Presidents; Mr. G. B. Hall, Hon. Treasurer; Messrs W. W. Bradley, W. Higgins, W. H. Thacker, J. Purdie, and the Revs. Hoban and Hollow were elected to the Board of Management. During the year the Rev. E. Harris retired on account of ill-health, and his place was filled by the appointment of Mr. Jas. Wighton. Mr. Harris was for many years a valued member of the Board, and we trust prolonged rest will soon see him strong and robust. The Rev. S. J. Hoban resigned on leaving the town and his seat was filled by the election of the Rev. Chas. Tregear. Owing to ill-health, Mr. G. B. Hall, Hon. Treasurer, had to resign. Mr. A. Collier kindly allowed himself to be appointed to the position. Your Committee earnestly hope Mr. Hall's health will be soon restored.

The following members now retire by effluxion of time; they are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly:—Messrs. W. Humble, W. C. Kernot, E. L. Jullien, and Rev. J. Forrest, together with the Rev. Chas. Tregear and Mr. J. Wighton, who retire according to rule, and are willing to be re-elected.

Grateful acknowledgements to all who have in any way assisted in money or in kind, or by devotion of their talent or time to the Hospital, are sincerely tendered. In conclusion, your Committee cannot but draw marked attention to the perilous financial outlook of the Institution, and feel they must urgently appeal for increased support to the generous public, who have up to now, kept the Institution going. Otherwise a curtailment of the usefulness of the Institution must occur, as it is impossible to continue with the expenses so much more than income.
