Sixty-Fourth Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management have again the honor to submit to Subscribers and Governors their 64th Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending June 30th, 1916. Notwithstanding the strenuous times in which we are passing through, your Committee is glad and thankful to be able to report that owing to the generous help of the charitable public, and to the fact that kindly people who have died have remembered the Hospital in their wills, your Committee have been able to carry on the Institution without falling back financially. This is a great thing to be able to say, considering the circumstances. The Total Ordinary Expenditure amounts to £7,911, showing a marked increase over last year's figures, being £535 in excess. Meat alone accounting for £360 of this total; bread and flour accounts for another £100. On the Income side the Government Grant is the same as in former years. Municipal Grants show a slight increase, £152 being received. Private Contributions are on about an average with recent former years. Entertainments show an increase of £110, and the Hospital Sunday and Saturday funds an increase of £47. The In-Patients' payments show a marked increase over last year of £600. Included in this sum is payment received from the Government on account of soldiers. The number of In-Patients treated was 1,380.

The Infectious Wards have been kept very busy throughout the year. Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis has now been added to the diseases we have to admit. The Defence authorities are at present erecting a Ward on the Infectious Diseases block for treatment of military patients, who may be stricken down with meningitis. Your Committee have undertaken to do the nursing and medical work, provided the authorities found the buildings, etc. The new Ward will accommodate about 12 cases; and extra Nurses' Quarters are also being erected. The total number of Patients passing through the Institution was 3,036; of these 1,502 were admitted to the Wards.

Out-Door and Casualty Patients.—Out-door: No. admitted, 1039; Casualties, 495; total, 1502. No. of occasions on which they attended, 5255. 225 Infectious Diseases patients were treated—Diphtheria, 131; Typhoid, 26; Phthisis, 9; Scarlet Fever, 11; Measles, 3; Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis, 25; Febricula, 20. Nine deaths occurred from Diphtheria, 2 from Typhoid Fever, 13 from Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis.

The rate of Mortality has been 8.3 for all cases, 7.5 for Hospital In-door Patients. This is slightly higher than last year. Twelve deaths occurred within 24 hours of admission.

Operating Theatre.—328 operations have been performed.

Daily average of occupied beds, 145;—Hospital, 73; Benevolent Asylum, 72. Infectious Wards, 11. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of 2 Benevolents to 1 In-Patient, was £74/7/9½. This is £4/18/2 less per bed than last year, and although the cost of food has been greatly increased in some items, the reduction in cost per bed is caused by the greater number of Patients who have been treated.

Wattle Day.—The Wattle Day League very generously decided to devote their takings last year to the Hospital. The ladies of the town worked most strenuously to make the movement a success, and the sum of £433/11/5 was realized. The Mayor of Geelong (Cr. W. Brownbill) and Mr. W. H. Thacker worked unceasingly in aid of the movement. To all who assisted, your Committee's grateful thanks are hereby tendered, and it is sincerely hoped that Wattle Day will be again organized in aid of the Hospital in the coming Spring.

Hospital Sunday.—Considerable difficulty was encountered in getting Lady Collectors to take this up, and consequently the work fell on a small section of enthusiastic workers. The effort was well organized under the able co-operation of Cr. W. Brownbill (Mayor of Geelong) and Mr. W. H. Thacker. The weather was greatly against us, both the Saturday and Sunday being most inclement, heavy rain falling for a great part of the time. Our own Nurses also worked most willingly. The Street Collections amounted to £191/6/11, £25/9/6 coming from the Mayor of Geelong West. Newtown and Chilwell did not take up a collection, promising to do so later on in the year, which, however, was not carried out. Together with the Church collections the sum of £677 was realized, which was £47 more than the previous year's gross total. All who in any way helped are hereby gratefully thanked.

Mrs. Hawkes is hereby gratefully thanked for her splendid help on many occasions to this Institution; also to the generous donors who enabled the Hospital to claim Mrs. Hawkes' offer. Entertainments.—£181/18/4 was received under this heading, nearly £19 of which came from Queenscliff, £20 from Meredith, £15 from Comunn na Feinne Society, and £18 from Lethbridge.

Beds.—Recently the Editors of the "Geelong Advertiser" and "Geelong Times" opened a Subscription List to supply new beds for the Infectious Diseases Wards, at £3 each. Forty beds have now been subscribed for. The generous donors are gratefully thanked for their prompt response to the appeal. Further on in the Report a list will be found of those who have given.

Egg Collections.—The editor of the Geelong Advertiser again very kindly organized an extensive Egg Collecting campaign, and nearly 1700 dozen eggs were received and preserved. They have kept splendidly up to the present time, and are a great help to the Institution. The Editor, Collectors, Donors, and Ladies who so generously offered their services to clean and pot them down, are gratefully thanked for their kind help; also the Head Teachers who gave the movement their generous help. The Preservative, "Ovo," in which the eggs were immersed, was given by Mr. A. J. Leckie; and Mr. T. A. Dickson gave Water Glass. Their kind help is now acknowledged.

Medical Staff.—Doctors F. J. Newman, A. W. Marwood, T. J. M. Kennedy and G. McCallum were re-elected by the Subscribers last year, with Drs. R. G. McPhee and H. F. Elvins as Honorary Anaesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively. Dr. B. C. Joel was appointed Honorary Oculist, and Dr. J. E.

Piper, Honorary Pathologist. The Committee's thanks are hereby tendered to these gentlemen for their services to the Institution. During the year Dr. McPhee obtained leave from your Committee, and went to the Front. Owing to the difficulty in getting a Resident Medical Officer, the Honorary Medical Staff have had to undertake a lot of extra work. Drs. Grimwade, Darby, and Morgan offered their services in any capacity they might be required. The Committee thankfully accepted their offer, and these three gentlemen have been administering Anæsthetics and seeing Out-Patients ever since.

Hospital Building.—The Inspector of Charities, when last visiting the Institution, remarked on the signs of age and wear of the present Hospital Buildings, and suggested that it might be necessary to spend the Endowment Fund in renovations. To this the Committee subsequently replied that the Endowment Fund had been left in perpetuity by the late Mr. John Thompson, of Keilambete, the interest only being available for maintenance. The Committee is also faced with an expenditure of some £2000 for sewerage. The work of sewering has been left in the hands of the Geelong Water-works and Sewerage Trust to carry out.

Your Committee have long recognised that a new Hospital was necessary, and will welcome any movement for the erection of same. It is roughly estimated that the cost would approximate close upon £40,000. The present building is old, has done its work, and is now out-of-date. The Committee recognise the desired end cannot be reached in a day, but a start should be made at once.

Gifts.—The following are gratefully thanked:—Ladies' Flower Mission, the Proprietors of the Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Argus, Age, Leader, Australasian and Worker, for supplying their respective journals. Thanks are also tendered to all who in any way assisted in money or kind. Very special thanks are hereby conveyed to the Editors of the Geelong Advertiser and Geelong Times. They have always assisted the Institution in every way possible for them to do so, and by their advocacy and leading articles have been instrumental in raising for the Institution large sums of money, and their splendid help is greatly appreciated. Grateful thanks are also tendered to the generous friends who provided the usual Christmas Dinner, together with plenty of tobacco and cigars, for the patients and inmates.

Legacies and Bequests.—An especial appeal is made to those who are able to leave a legacy to the Institution when making their wills. Bequests have been largely instrumental during the past year in enabling the Institution to carry on.

Obituary.—With deep regret your Committee have to record the loss of a valued Member of the Committee through death, viz., Dr. J. Small. Dr. Small served as a Member of the Committee for 26 years, and his valuable counsels and mature judgment on Hospital matters have been much missed.

Lady Collector.—It was thought that there was scope for a Lady Collector in addition to the permanent Collector employed. Miss O'Connor was appointed to solicit donations, and has justified her appointment by her results. She has collected since her appointment approximately £98.

Reserve and Endowment Fund.—The amount to credit of Reserve Fund is £3954/5/2; and the Endowment Fund Account amounts to £7685/2/6. The Bank Balance on 30th June, 1916 was £966/17/11. Against this, accounts of about £900 are owing; so that the Liabilities practically extinguish the Assets, under Current Account at Bank.

Nursing Department.—During the year ten Nurses presented themselves for the Final Examination of the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association, all of whom were successful in passing. Fourteen probationers entered the Hospital as vacancies occurred, and were accepted for training.

Infectious Wards.—The Infectious Wards have been kept busy throughout the year. The average daily patients under treatment have been over 11. Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis having made its appearance, this very deadly disease has had to be treated. The Municipalities still pay at the rate of £60 per annum per occupied bed, although the cost of every bed occupied in the General Hospital for year ending 30th June, 1915, was estimated by the Government Inspector to cost £73/7/-

Committee.—At the last Annual Meeting Mr. G. Martin, J.P., was re-elected President; Dr. J. Small and Mr. J. Nicol, Vice-Presidents; Mr. A. Collier, Honorary Treasurer; Messrs W. Humble, E. L. Jullien, W. C. Kernot, J. Wighton, Revs. J. Forrest and C. Tregear, were elected to the Board of Management.

On the death of Dr. Small, Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy was elected to his seat; and Mr. W. C. Kernot was elected Vice-President, vice Dr. Small, deceased. The following Members now retire by effluxion of time; they are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly:—Messrs. Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy, F. J. Leary, E. Philpot, J. Purdie, R. Williams and J. P. McCabe Doyle.

Grateful acknowledgments to all who have assisted the Institution are sincerely tendered. We have had a lot of splendid help during the past 12 months, and have much to be thankful for.
