The Committee of Management of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum (Incorporated) have the honor to present to the Governors and Subscribers their Sixty-sixth Annual Report and Balance Sheets for the Financial Year ended 30th June, 1918.

Financial.—The finances of the institution are causing your Committee concern. The year started with a credit balance of £212, and ends with a credit of £24. There is thus a deficiency of £188, and accounts now owing amount to approximately £800. We therefore start the new year with a debt of £988, notwithstanding that £421 was received from special extraordinary donations and £515/9/10 from the Police and Firemen's efforts.

These unexpected receipts saved the institution from a more serious ending to the financial year. The total income from all sources amounted to £8,843, and the total expenditure was £8,914. £1,599 was collected by the Secretary from In-patients towards their maintenance (this is a record), and £113 was received from the Out-patients' department, making a total of £1,712 altogether from patients towards their treatment.

The Municipalities of the whole district only gave £188 towards the General Hospital's maintenance.

The Hospital Sunday Fund receipts were £563. This is £51 lower than preceding year, which was £63 less than its forerunner. The present year is the lowest for six years.

In December the Hospital Attendants' Wages Board came into existence, and in March the Chemists and Dispensers' Board. This has increased the expenditure about £750 yearly.

Drugs, dressings, and wages all show a high rise in cost. The total expenditure, £8,913, compares with £8,023 for previous year, and £6,670 for year 1913, the number of patients being 129 less for 1918.

The private subscriptions have been well represented with a total of £1,279.

Items, "Surgery and Dispensary," show an increase for the year of £471. Wages, £411. Wages increase is caused by six months working under the Hospital Attendants' Wages Board and Dispensers' Award.

Infectious Diseases Wards.—362 patients were admitted for treatment. This is the heaviest year since the wards were opened. The diseases were as follow:—Diphtheria, 260; Scarlet Fever, 92; Cerebro Spinal Meningitis, 2; Febricula, 8.

Under an award of the Board of Health made some years ago your Committee has been compelled to treat patients from the Councils in the Infectious Diseases Wards at the rate of £60 per occupied bed. It is needless to say each bed costs much more. During the year your Committee met a Conference of the Municipalities interested, with a view to obtaining more equitable payment, as the Government does not pay anything towards the upkeep of the wards through the Government grant.

The Councils offered £80 per bed—this was not considered enough by the Hospital authorities, and the offer was not accepted. The Councils at the time said that (if) it could be proved that each occupied bed cost more than £80 per annum they would be willing to pay the extra cost. Your Committee therefore engaged a Melbourne firm of chartered accountants to go into the cost per bed for a period of six months from January to June, 1918. Their finding will be to hand shortly.

The General Hospital has for some years had to bear the extra cost of treating these infectious patients, which your Committee do not consider at all equitable.

Out-door and Casualty Patients.—Out-door Patients admitted, 911; casualties, 401. Total, 1,312. Mortality rate has been 6 per cent. for all cases, and 3.2 for hospital cases.

Operating Theatre.—346 operations have been performed.

Occupied Beds.—Daily Average—General Hospital, 74; Benevolent Asylum, 58. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two benevolent beds to one In-patient was £86 9s. 11d. This is the highest ever experienced, but will go higher yet.

Kitchener Memorial Hospital.—The late Mr. William Dutton, under his will, left a considerable sum of money towards the rebuilding of the Hospital, amounting to some thousands of pounds. The matter is involved in a lawsuit with the relatives. It is expected that eventually the new hospital will receive what the testator bequeathed to it. The late Miss M. A. Raven also left £200 in aid of the above.

Hospital Sunday.—It is deplored that Hospital Sunday receipts have shown a falling off during the last two years, and it is hoped that this year a special effort will be made by the ladies of the city and district to organise a really effective effort. The fact that hospitals perform a national service in looking after the health of those who are unable to pay for their medical attention and nursing must not be lost sight of, owing to the heavy drain on the purses of the charitable. £563 was received, against £614 last year. All who assisted are hereby gratefully thanked, and a renewal of their kind help and interest for the coming annual collection is earnestly solicited.

Government Grant.—This was again reduced by the Government from £2,250 in 1917 to £1,913 in 1918. Your institution seems to be specially selected by the Government authorities when the pruning knife is to be applied. In the year 1899, £3,450 was received by way of grant; since then the grant has been gradually reduced to £1,913, as above stated. The reason is not clearly understood. Some years ago the Government instructed that special efforts were to be made to collect contributions from In-patients. This has been done, and some £1,600 a year is got in from this source, against £500 in former times. The Government, however, now turns round and says: "These hospitals must be taking in rich patients, else how could they collect such large sums of money from them. The wards are being crowded out by the well-to-do, we will therefore reduce the grant to show our disapproval." It appears also that if an institution is economically managed it gets less, on the assumption that it does not require so much help as a more extravagantly run institution. In this institution, at any rate, every effort is made to keep it for only those who are genuinely in need of assistance.

The question of Intermediate Hospitals for the man with a family and £350 a year or so will have to be faced shortly, as he is not considered eligible by the Government authorities for admission to General Hospitals.

Wages Board.—In December last a Wages Board was brought into operation for all the Hospital employees, except nurses and officers, employed in the institution. From March a Board came into operation for the Dispenser's department. Your Committee was never consulted as to how this innovation would affect the finances of the institution. As far as can be calculated at present it will increase the expenditure by £750 per year, employing the same staff. Immediately this increased cost was placed upon the institution the Government notified that they intended to reduce the grant £210 per year. Together with the Wages Board increase and the lessened Government grant we now have to obtain increased funds from somewhere to the extent of £1000 per year. Where and how it is to be obtained your Committee cannot foresee.

The members of the Geelong Police Force, in conjunction with the Geelong Fire Brigade, recently organised an effort to help the funds of the General Hospital. Their efforts were splendidly successful, and to date we have received £515 9s. 10d.—£290 more will eventually be received on this account. Your Committee's most hearty and sincere thanks are hereby tendered to Superintendent Harris, the police officers under his command, and to Captain Patterson and members of the Fire Brigade who worked so indefatigably to make the effort a success. The ladies and wives of the various officers who assisted are also gratefully thanked; also Mr. A. J. Young (secretary of the Geelong Racing Club) and the members of the club who were instrumental to a large degree in helping to make the race day a success.

Entertainments.—£561 17s. 10d. was received, the principal organisers being as follow:—Police and Firemen's Carnival Race Meeting, £515 9s. 10d.; Mayor of Geelong West, £3 2s.; Anakie P.L.C. Dance, £9 0s. 9d.; Collections Steiglitz and Meredith (per W. J. Watson, Esq.), £20 1s.; Dance, Mount Moriac, £1 12s. 6d.; Miss E. Mercer, £5; per D. Austin, £1 13s. 6d.; per Mrs. B. Hall, £9 11s. 3d.; per T. Richardson, £1 4s. 3d.

Egg Collections.—The editor of the "Geelong Advertiser" again organised an annual egg campaign, with most satisfactory results, and nearly 2412 dozen eggs were received and preserved. Mrs. J. Small undertook the washing and cleaning of the eggs, with other ladies, and put them in the preservative. The editor, collectors, donors, and ladies are hereby gratefully thanked for their kindness; also the head teachers.

Medical Staff.—Drs. F. J. Newman, A. W. Marwood, T. J. M. Kennedy, and G. McCallum were re-elected by the subscribers last year, with Drs. R. G. McPhee and H. F. Elvins as honorary anaesthetists and skiagraphists respectively. Dr. B. C. Joel was appointed honorary oculist, and Dr. J. E. Piper honorary pathologist. Drs. Marwood, Elvins, and McPhee are still on active service at the front. Dr. G. McCallum has kindly undertaken charge of the X Ray department during Dr. Elvin's absence. Drs. Grimwade, Darby, and Morgan have continued their service as locum tenens for the members of the staff who are away at the front. The Committee's thanks are hereby tendered to the Staff for their professional assistance to the institution.

Gifts.—The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the Ladies' Flower Mission for supplying flowers, the proprietors of the "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Australasian," and "Federal Record" for supplying their respective journals. Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the institution who provided the usual Christmas dinner, tobacco, and cigars for the patients and inmates.

Legacies and Bequests.—We would bring the matter of remembering the institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this charity when making their wills. The receipts from bequests have during the last few years been of great benefit in keeping the institution going, bridging over the shortage of the ordinary income and enabling the work to be carried on.

Reserve and Endowment Fund.—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £5,454 5s. 2d., and the Endowment Fund, £7,685 2s. 6d.

Obituary.—With very deep regret your Committee have to record the death of a valued member of the nursing staff, Nurse B. L. Dickson, who gave her life in the service of the institution.

Honor Board.—Your Committee has erected an Honor Board in the lobby of the General Hospital, enumerating the names of those members of the Staff who have nobly gone to the front to protect their country from the Hun.

Nursing Department.—During the year fourteen nurses presented themselves for examination and obtained their certificates from the R.V.T.N.A., all passing. Six of our nurses have been accepted for service abroad, while seven probationers have entered the hospital as vacancies occurred.

Governors.—Miss M. J. Boxell was elected a governor for two years.

Life Subscribers Elected.—Mr. M. J. Galvin, Mrs. G. E. England, Mr. C. Mountjoy, and Mrs. L. M. Sugg.

Committee.—At the last annual meeting Mr. George Martin, J.P., was re-elected President; Messrs. J. Nicol and C. Shannon, Vice-Presidents; Messrs. W. C. Kernot, W. W. Bradley, J. Purdie, W. Higgins, G. Humble, and Rev. S. Hollow were elected to the board of Management.

During the year the Rev. Stanley Hollow resigned his seat on leaving Geelong and the Rev. C. Kingsley Cole was elected by the Committee to fill the vacancy. He retires according to the rules, but is eligible for re-election. Mr. W. C. Kernot, after 19 years as a member of the Board, has intimated his intention of retiring. The following also retire by effluxion of time; they are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly:—Messrs. E. L. Jullien, J. Wighton, J. Forrest, and Rev. C. Trugear. This makes the statutory six.

In conclusion the Committee offer their grateful thanks for the generous help that has been given to the institution during the past 12 months. The terrible world war shows no sign of being brought to a conclusion in the near future. With so many other calls upon the public our finances have been, of course, affected, but we have much to be thankful for in the help we have received. Had it not been for the introduction of the Wages Board and reduction of Government grant we could still have paid our way.

Your Committee have exercised strict economy in all items of expenditure and have given much valuable time in the discharge of their duties. They ask confidently for the continued interest and support of the ladies and gentlemen who have so graciously and heartily helped in the past.
