FINANCIAL.—Your Committee regret to have to announce that the year has ended with a deficit of £2760/4/3, exclusive of £377/14/0, the amount in hand remaining from the previous year, which really makes a deficit of £3137/18/3.

This is due to various reasons, among them being increases to daily paid staff, under various Arbitration Awards, the greater number of patients treated, and the higher cost of all provisions, drugs, dressings, etc.

The total income from all sources amounted to £9813/9/0, and the total expenditure was £12,573/13/3. The Secretary collected £1990/0/5 from In-Patients towards their maintenance, and £160/13/1 was received from the Out-Patients' Department.

The Municipalities of the whole District gave £163/2/0.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE WARDS.—691 patients were admitted for treatment. This is the heaviest year since the Wards were opened. The diseases were as follows:—Diphtheria, 596, and Scarlet Fever, 95.

The Councils have been again approached, with a view to increasing the payment for Infectious Diseases Patients to a figure more in keeping with the cost of upkeep. They have offered to again approach the Government to increase the payment under agreement to £80 per annum per bed per patient, and a conference will be held on July 28th, between a Sub-Committee of the Hospital and of the Infectious Diseases Group of Municipalities, to endeavor to arrive at a settlement on a basis which will be satisfactory to both parties.

OUTDOOR AND CASUALTY PATIENTS.—Outdoor patients admitted, 624; Casualties, 655; total, 1279.

OPERATING THEATRE.—370 operations have been performed.

OCCUPIED BEDS.—Daily average—General Hospital, 96.5; Benevolent Asylum, 58.6. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two Benevolent beds to one In-Patient, was £99/14/3.

HOSPITAL SUNDAY FUND.—Your Committee regret that this item shows a serious shrinkage during the past year. The amount collected being only £636/3/0, as against £988/3/2 last year. Evidently the calls made on the public on behalf of the Kitchener Memorial Hospital have seriously affected it, and they trust that this year the response will be better.

The wages of the Sisters, Carpenter, Engineer, and other male members of the staff have been increased during the year, which has resulted in an increased cost to the Institution of £600.

The Government Grant remains the same this year as last, namely, £1900.

On April 1st, 1920, the patients' friends were granted the privilege of visiting them in Hospital, on other than free visiting days, at a charge of sixpence for each visit. This has been a great convenience which has been much appreciated, and has also made an increase in the income of £245/4/6.

EGG COLLECTION.—The Editor of the Geelong "Advertiser" again organised an Egg Collection with most satisfactory results. 2062 dozen were received and preserved. The Editor, Collectors, Donors, and Head Teachers of State Schools are gratefully and sincerely thanked for their valuable assistance.

Your Committee have pleasure in reporting that the Australian Comforts Fund have donated a bed complete with mattress, bedding, bed table, etc., for the use of discharged

ex Australian Imperial Force-men, and their immediate dependents. It is also bearing the expense of the treatment of a certain number of these cases in Hospital.

MEDICAL STAFF.—An alteration was made in the appointment of the Medical Staff of the Institution, and under alteration of By-Law No. 54, two additional Medical Officers were appointed as Honoraries to the Out-Patients Department, also Honorary Pathologist, Skiagraphist, Oculist and Dentist. The gentlemen appointed to these offices have rendered valuable assistance to the Institution during the past year, and your Committee desires to tender its thanks to them for their valuable services.

Your Committee especially desires to express its appreciation of the work done by the Nursing Staff under trying conditions. There has been an exceptional number of patients treated during the year, which has placed a great strain on their resources, also the shortage of Nursing Staff, which has been due to the want of suitable Probationers to fill the positions rendered vacant.

GIFTS.—The Committee desire to tender its thanks to the Belmont W.C.T. Union, Ladies' Flower Mission, for supplying flowers; the Proprietors of the Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Argus, Age, Leader and Australasian for supplying their respective Journals.

Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the Institution, who provided the usual Christmas Dinner, Tobacco and Cigars for the patients and inmates.

LEGACIES AND BEQUESTS.—We would bring the matter of remembering the Institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this Charity when making their Wills. The receipts from bequests have been of great benefit to the Institution, and trust that in view of the increased cost of maintaining the Institution, this item will be increased.

RESERVE AND ENDOWMENT FUND.—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £7512/6/5, and Endowment Fund £7685/2/6.

OBITUARY.—During the year, we have lost the services of Mr. A. J. Young, who has been Auditor for many years. Your Committee expresses its sympathy with the relatives of the deceased gentleman, and desires to place on record its appreciation of his sterling worth and the amount of valuable assistance he rendered the Institution.

NURSING DEPARTMENT.—During the year thirteen Nurses presented themselves for, and were successful in passing the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Fifteen Probationers have been appointed during the year.
