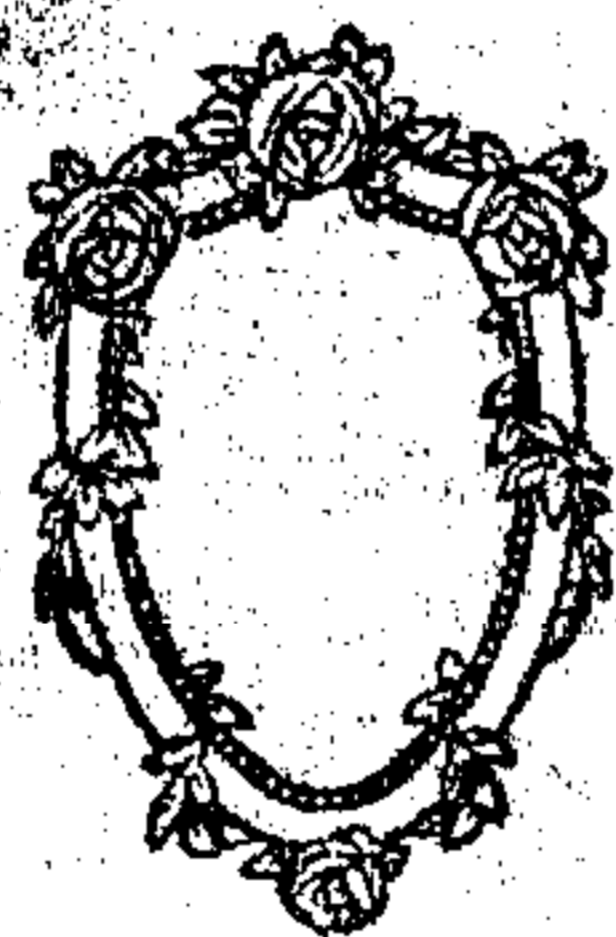

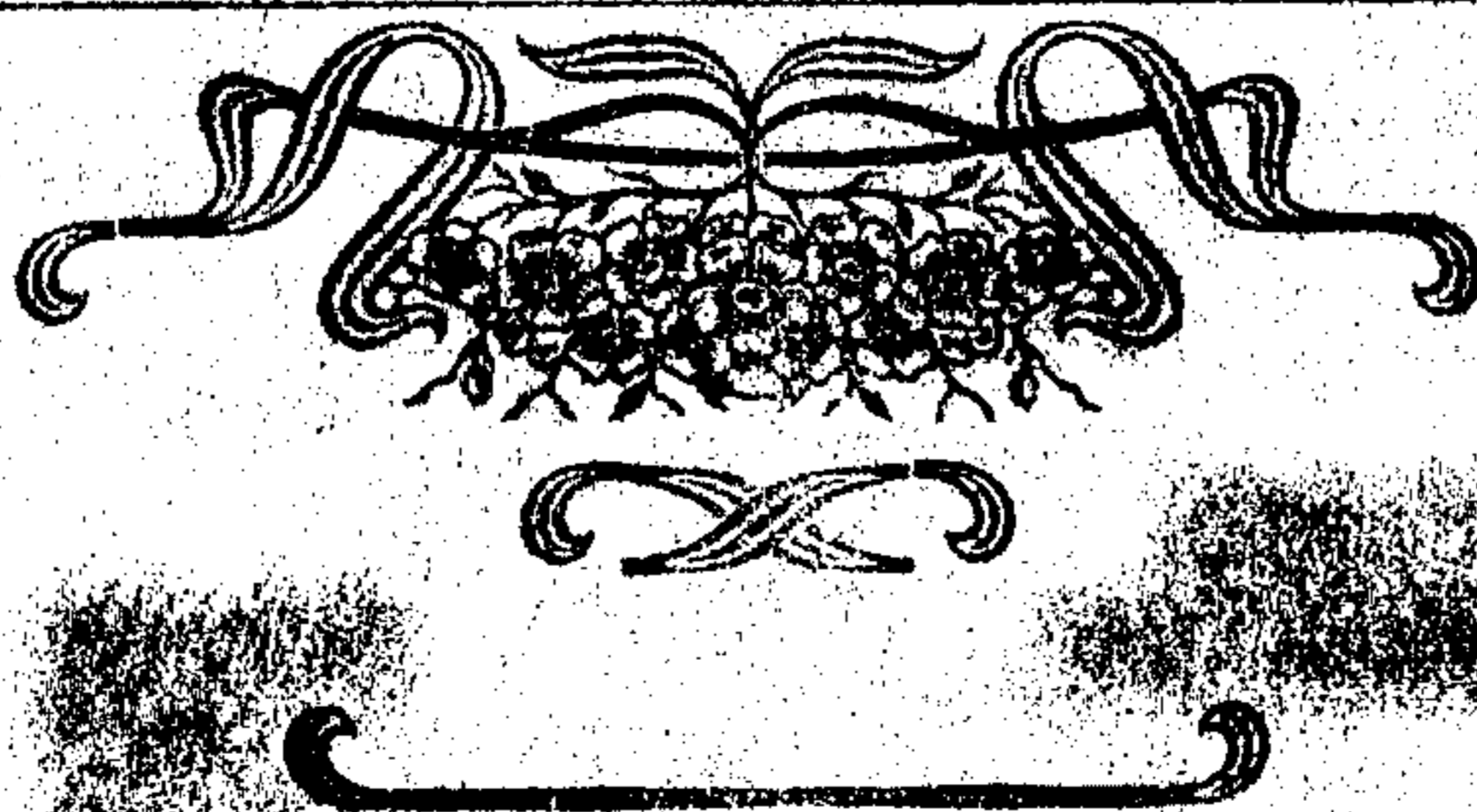

FINANCIAL.—Your Committee regret to have to announce that the year has again ended with a deficit—this time of £1105/9/10. At the beginning of the year the deficit was £2760/4/3. This was reduced by a transfer from Reserve of £2500, £1000 of which was re-transferred to Fixed Deposit.

The expenditure has been practically the same as the previous year; but the income in some instances less. Municipal Grants show a decrease of £38 and Private Contributions £57.

The total income from all sources amounted to £17,106/7/3, and the total expenditure was £18,211/17/1. The Secretary collected £2875/19/11 from In-patients towards their maintenance, and £169/8/6 was received from the Out-patients Department.

The Municipalities of the whole District gave £125/12/0.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES WARDS.—534 patients were admitted for treatment. The diseases were as follows:—Diphtheria 45, and Scarlet Fever 80.

After much correspondence between the Group and the Hospital, also to some extent with the Honorable the Treasurer, a slight increase has been obtained in this Department: The payment for the year 1921-1922 is to be at the rate of 4/- per diem (£74/16/0 per annum per occupied bed). This is an increase on the amount previously paid (£60), but your Committee are not at all satisfied with the position as it stands.

OUTDOOR AND CASUALTY PATIENTS.—Outdoor patients admitted, 558; Casualties, 625; total, 1183.

OPERATING THEATRE.—413 operations have been performed.

OCCUPIED BEDS.—Daily average—General Hospital, 91.4; Benevolent Asylum, 65.4. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two Benevolent beds to one In-patient was £100/5/0.

HOSPITAL SUNDAY FUND.—Your Committee are pleased to report that the receipts from this item are larger than last year, namely, £810/7/8, as against, £636/3/0. This is a satisfactory increase, but in view of the extra expense entailed by the cost of necessaries for the up-keep of the Institution, they hope this will continue to show an increase from year to year.

GOVERNMENT GRANT.—This item has been increased from £1900 to £2000, but owing to the difficulty which has arisen with regard to payment for Infectious patients, the instalment for the last quarter of the year has not been received.

VISITING FEES.—On April 1st, 1920, the patients' friends were granted the privilege of visiting them in the Hospital on other than free visiting days, at a charge of sixpence for each visit. This has been a great convenience, which has been much appreciated, and has also made an increase in the income of £281/9/6, as against £245/4/6 last year.

EGG COLLECTION.—The Editor of the Geelong Advertiser again organised an Egg Collection, with most satisfactory results. 4646 dozen eggs were received and preserved. It was suggested by Mr Thomas, Inspector of Schools, that the surplus eggs over and above the quantity required for the use of the Hospital for the twelve months, should be given to assist the collection started for the benefit of St. Catherine's Orphanage and the Protestant Orphanage. Of the number donated to this Institution by the Schools, 1206 dozen were sent to each of these. The Editor, Collectors, Donors, and Head Teachers of State Schools are gratefully and sincerely thanked for their valuable assistance.

BLANKET SNOWBALL.—In August last the Editor of the "Advertiser" also organised an appeal to supply Five Hundred New Blankets to the Institution. This appeal met with success, which is characteristic of all this Newspaper's efforts on behalf of the Hospital. The total of £478 1/- was received, and as a result the Hospital was entirely fitted up with new blankets.

IN-PATIENTS' FEES—The amount received from this Department is easily a record, being about £900 greater than any previous year. To some extent the support given by the Australian Comforts Fund in paying for some ex-A.I.F. men, their dependants and relatives, to the extent of £142/10/0. The patients concerned are very grateful for this assistance, as it is confined to cases who, at the best, would be in a position to pay a nominal sum for their treatment, and that, even, would be in most cases hardship.

MEDICAL STAFF.—Your Committee desires to thank all members of the Honorary Staff for their valuable assistance during the past year.

Your Committee especially desires to express its appreciation of the work done by the Nurses under trying conditions. Letters have been received from patients who have been treated in the Wards during the year, and from their relatives; in all cases expressing appreciation of the kindness and attention of the Nurses.

GIFTS.—The Committee desire to tender its thanks to the Belmont W.C.T. Union, Ladies Flower Mission, for supplying Flowers; His Worship the Mayor, for weekly supply of Flowers; the proprietors of the Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Argus, Age, Leader, and Australasian, for supplying their respective Journals.

Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the Institution who provided the usual Christmas Dinner, Tobacco and Cigars, for the Patients and Inmates.

LEGACIES AND BEQUESTS.—We would bring the matter of remembering the Institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this Charity when making their Wills. The receipts from bequests have been of great benefit to the Institution, and trust that in view of the increased cost of maintaining the Institution, this item will be increased.

RESERVE AND ENDOWMENT FUND.—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £5705/6/5, and Endowment Fund £9393/12/7.

OBITUARY.—Mr Charles Shannon, who was for many years President of the Hospital, passed away during the year. Although he has not been a member of the Committee since 1918, your Committee feel that they cannot but remind the Subscribers of the valuable services rendered by the late gentleman.

Mr F. J. Leary, whose services your Committee lost early in the present year, has been a member since 1900, and in that time had given most valuable assistance, both as a Member of the General Committee and the Finance Committee. In common with everyone who knew him, his death came as a great shock to all Members of the Committee, and his loss will be very severely felt.

NURSING DEPARTMENT.—During the year seven Nurses presented themselves for, and were successful in passing, the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Twelve Probationers have been appointed during the year.

LIFE SUBSCRIBERS ELECTED.—Dr Hicks and Mr R. Brady.

LIFE GOVERNORS ELECTED.—Messrs L. Hirst, W. C. Kernot, G. A. List, and C. H. Cotton.

At the last Annual Meeting Mr James Wighton was re-elected President. Messrs W. W. Bradley and F. J. Leary Vice-Presidents, and Mr H. K. S. Rusden Honorary Treasurer; Messrs J. A. Thear, James D'Helin, E. L. Jullien, and Rev. C. Kingsley Cole were elected members of the Committee of Management. According to the Rules, the following retire:—Mr J. Wighton, President; Messrs W. W. Bradley and E. L. Jullien, Vice-Presidents; Mr H. K. S. Rusden, Hon. Treasurer. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

The following members of the Committee also retire by effluxion of time:—Messrs D. Laidlaw, W. H. Thacker, J. F. S. Shannon, Revs. J. Thomas, T. Worsley Maguire and Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

In conclusion, the Committee desire to cordially thank all who have in any way assisted the Institution during the year, including the Press, for its criticism and suggestions.
