FINANCIAL.—Your Committee regret to have to announce that the year has again ended with an overdraft, this time of £864/8/7. At the beginning of the year the overdraft was £1105/9/10. This overdraft had to be met by a transfer of £1500 from Fixed Deposit by which means the overdraft at the end of 1920-21 financial year has been wiped off, but that account is still £864/8/7 behind.

The expenditure has been less than the previous year, owing to better prices in several of the contracts. The Municipal Grants show an increase of £34/10/0, and Private Contributions £108/13/9.

The total income from all sources amounted to £13,061/8/6, and the total outgo was £13,925/17/1. The Secretary collected £2169/12/2 from In-patients towards their maintenance, and £203/3/6 was received from the Out-Patients' Department.

The Municipalities of the whole District gave £160/2/0. This is an increase of roughly £35 on the previous year. The majority of this increase however, has been provided by the Municipality of Geelong, which increased its donation from £25 to £50, for which the Committee are grateful.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES WARDS.—229 patients were admitted for treatment. The diseases were as follows :—Diphtheria 177, and Scarlet Fever 52.

There is very little alteration in the arrangement as regards payment for patients in the Infectious Diseases Wards. Last year a slight increase was obtained, and the rate paid was 4/- per diem. It is understood that if it is found that the cost of these patients is in excess of this amount, an increase will be considered by the Government.

OUT-DOOR AND CASUALTY PATIENTS.—Outdoor patients admitted, 686; Casualties 727, total 1413; a gross increase of 230.

OPERATING THEATRE.—594 operations have been performed, an increase of 181.

OCCUPIED BEDS.—Daily averages—General Hospital 66.6; Benevolent Asylum 17.6. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two Benevolent Beds to one Inpatient was £125/3/3, being an increase as against 1922, owing to higher cost of living, of £25/1/9.

HOSPITAL SUNDAY FUND.—Your Committee are pleased to report that the receipts for Hospital Sunday Appeal in October last, amounted to £815/0/5, as against £810/7/8, for the previous year.

Owing to the Gala Day arrangements clashing with our October Appeal, it was decided to alter the Appeal to May, and accordingly such was made again in May of this year, which resulted in a return of £976/9/1. Your Committee feel that by making this alteration, the position will be made clearer in the minds of the Hospital supporters, so that Gala Day and Hospital Sunday will not be confused as before.

During the year several Band Concerts were given by the City Band, St. Augustine's Band, and Geelong West Band. They were assisted by Honorary Collectors in every case, with the result that the Hospital Sunday Fund was considerably augmented. The Members of the Trades Hall, and of the City Fire Brigade made the collections at the Concerts given by the City Band; St. Augustine's Orphanage Boys collected at the Concerts given by their Band, and members of the Geelong West Fire Brigade at Concerts given by the Geelong West Band. Their action in co-operating with the Bands in this manner is very much appreciated by the Committee, and they desire to tender their best thanks for their assistance

In conclusion, they would like to make special mention of the effort made by the Winchelsea Hospital Committee. They organised a special day and held a Bazaar and Sports Meeting; unfortunately the day set apart, June 4th, turned out too wet for them to hold their effort, and they had to postpone it until June 9th. As a result of their splendid organisation and effort, the sum of £146/8/10 was raised, and your Committee feel that the thanks of all supporters of the Hospital is due to Winchelsea for this splendid result.

GOVERNMENT GRANT.—During the year ¹⁹²³ the inmates of the Benevolent Asylum were transferred to Ballarat, and as a result the Government consider that their transfer has meant a reduction in the cost of the upkeep of the Institution. This is a very moot point, as several factors have to be taken into consideration. Up to the present, however, it is felt by the Committee that there would be very little saving, as a considerable sum was paid towards their upkeep in the shape of pensions. A late advice from the Treasury Department, however, states that the Department have considered that a reduction of £500 for the year in the Government Grant, is deemed reasonable. Needless to say, this does not meet with the approval of your Committee. The Government Grant paid for 1921-22 was £2000, roughly one sixth of the cost of maintenance. It will be seen from this, that the share the Government bear in the cost of upkeep is very small, and a reduction of 25% of the amount seems out of all proportion.

VISITING FEES.—On April 1st, 1920, the patients' friends were granted the privilege of visiting them in the Hospital on other than free visiting days, at a charge of sixpence for each visit. This has been a great convenience, which has been much appreciated, and has also made an increase in the income of £303/6/6 as against £281/9/6 last year.

EGG COLLECTION.—The Editor of the "Geelong Advertiser" again organised an Egg Collection, with most satisfactory results. 3140 dozen eggs were received and preserved.

The Editor, Collectors, Donors and Head Teachers of State Schools are gratefully and sincerely thanked for their valuable assistance.

MEDICAL STAFF.—Your Committee desire to thank all members of the Honorary Medical Staff for their valuable assistance during the past year. They would like to particularly mention the valuable services rendered by the Honorary Masseuse. During the year, she has treated individual cases, with highly satisfactory results, and the members of the Honorary Medical Staff speak very highly of her services. The Committee also desire to take this occasion of publicly recording their thanks to Miss Phillips, for the very considerable amount of valuable assistance she has rendered the Institution.

Owing to alterations having to be made in arrangement of the Wards, during the re-building scheme, the conditions under which the Nurses have had to carry on their work have been particularly trying. They have however, accepted the position in the best spirit, and their work continues to be of a very high character.

The Committee still continue to receive letters of appreciation from patients who have received treatment, and from their relatives, and all patients, without exception, discharged after treatment, have expressed their gratitude for the care and attention bestowed upon them.

GIFTS.—The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the Ladies Flower Mission, for supplying flowers, the Ex Mayor (Ald. Hitchcock), weekly supply of flowers, and would like particularly to mention the energy of the Belmont W. C. T. Union, for their annual collection of goods for the use of the Hospital. This donation covers a wide range, being composed of groceries of all kinds, vegetables, clothing, and donations of cash. The Committee very much appreciate the Union's continued interest in the Institution, and desire to express their thanks for their assistance. The Proprietors of the "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," and "Australasian," for supplying their respective journals, and Messrs. Johnson & Ebbott for use of Phonograph for Nurses' Entertainments.

Last Christmas marked the last Xmas Dinner given to the Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum in the Institution. The dinner has for many years, been regularly provided through the generosity of sympathisers in the district, and their kindness has always been highly appreciated by the inmates. This year, nothing was lacking which could make the event an enjoyable one for the old people, and when they left, they one and all, expressed their appreciation of all that had been done for them during their stay.

It will be necessary now to provide Christmas Dinner for such of the Hospital patients as are able to enjoy it, and although the number will be much less, it is hoped that the friends of the Institution will continue their support in this direction.

LEGACIES AND BEQUESTS.—We would bring the matter of remembering the Institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this Charity when making their Wills. The receipts from bequests have been of great benefit to the Institution, and the Committee trust that in view of the increased cost of maintenance, this item will be increased.

RESERVE AND ENDOWMENT FUND.—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £7501/14/5, and Endowment Fund £9393/12/7.

OBITUARY.—Mr. H. Blomfield Brown who was a member of the Hospital Committee since 1894, and for many years Chairman of the Finance Committee, passed away during the year. During his period of membership, he spent a considerable amount of time furthering the interests of the Institution, and although he relinquished his position on the Committee some months previous to his decease, the influence of the good work he gave to the Institution has left its mark, and the Committee feel that his death has been a great loss to them.

The Committee regret to report the decease of Nurse Rita Jeffreys, who died in the Institution on August 8th from Typhoid Fever. She was ill altogether for four weeks, and every effort was made to save her life, but without success. In this connection, the Committee would like to mention the untiring attention of Dr. McPhee, who did not spare himself in his efforts, and the Committee are very grateful to him for his services.

NURSING DEPARTMENT.—During the year twelve Nurses presented themselves for, and were successful in passing the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Ten Probationers have been appointed during the year.

At the last Annual Meeting Mr. James Wighton was re-elected President; Messrs W. W. Bradley and E. L. Jullien, Vice-Presidents, and Mr. H. K. S. Rusden, Hon. Treasurer. Rev. J. Thomas, Messrs. J. F. S. Shannon, D. Laidlaw, W. H. Thacker, Rev. T. Worsley Maguire and Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy were elected Members of the Committee of Management. According to the Hospital and Charities Act, the following gentlemen retire:—Mr. J. Wighton, President; Messrs. W. W. Bradley and E. L. Jullien, Vice-Presidents; Mr. H. K. S. Rusden, Hon. Treasurer. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

The following Members of the Committee also retire by effluxion of time:—Messrs. J. T. Kerley, T. McCormick, and F. G. H. Ritchie. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly, with the exception of Mr. T. McCormick.

✓ Your Committee have pleasure in reporting ¹⁹²² that a commencement was made with the building of the new Hospital on the 23rd October last. The tender of Messrs. F. and E. Deague was accepted by the Kitchener Memorial Hospital Committee for the erection of six Wards, at a total cost of £38,101. These Wards are to be used as Male and Female Medical, Male and Female Surgical, Children's Ward, and Mid-wifery Ward.

The first foundation stone was laid by His Worship the Mayor, Ald. Howard Hitchcock, on 8th November 1922, in the presence of a large gathering of the public of Geelong. On 21st February 1923 the four other foundation stones were laid, one by Mr. A. H. Bowman, representing the original Kitchener Memorial Hospital Committee, who had, by their efforts, raised the sum of £30,000. This Committee consisted of Messrs A. H. Bowman, C. Myers and C. Brownlow. The foundation stone of the Children's Ward was laid by Miss Mary Doreen O'Halloran (Freshwater Creek State School) and Master Gordon Smith (South Geelong State School), as representing the State School Children of the district. Miss E. Lascelles, on behalf of the Geelong Branch of the Red Cross Society, laid the foundation stone of the Mid-wifery Ward, and the President of the Hospital Committee (Mr. J. Wighton) laid the foundation stone of the Female Medical Ward.

Excellent progress has been made to date with the contract, and it is hoped that all the Wards will be in full commission by the end of the present year. . . .

✓ The Kitchener Memorial Plans Committee appointed to discuss plans of the arrangements of the different Wards have given considerable time and thought to this matter, and with the Architects, Messrs. Henderson, Alsop and Martin, of Melbourne, in conjunction with Messrs. Laird and Buchan are providing to give Geelong the most up to date Hospital in the State, if not in Australia. ✓ Every conceivable thing making for the efficiency of treatment, the conveniences of the patients and Staff has been included. ✓ Time alone will show the full result of their efforts, though as far as can be seen, the new Wards will be the highest example of modern and aseptic treatment it is possible to obtain. //

In conclusion, the Committee desire to cordially thank all who have in any way assisted the Institution during the year, including the Press for its criticism and suggestions.
