'The Misses McCann's Ladies' school is listed in the Geelong and Western District directory 1882-83 as being on the south side of Aphrasia St. This was Clifton House, Newtown hill of the 1888 advertisement in which combined with a moral and physical training, sound teaching to matriculation was guaranteed. Miss McCann was assisted by 'teachers of tested ability.'

[Reference in advertisements to the school name being Clifton House Ladies' College]

The Morrow Advertiser indexes give the following information.

'On 1.1.1889 the school moved to temporary premises at Riljajag, Latrobe Tce and was moving mid-year to Knowle House.'

[Knowle House had long been used as educational premises. The Geelong College and Geelong Grammar both began on this site.]

On 7.8.1889 [Miss] Annie McCann aged 54 died at Knowle House. Her death notice in GA 8.8.1889 states this was from heart disease but gives no family information. The parents listed for Mary are those stated on Annie's death registration. The McCann families in Geelong were mainly Scottish [Presbyterian] or Irish [Catholic]. Annie is buried alone in the C of E section of Eastern Cemetery.

In the GA of 8.8.1889 an advertisement for the school [now Newtown Ladies' College] named the teachers for dancing and calisthenics. Mary McCann is listed in 1892 rates as schoolmistress and owner of 2-storey school room and gymnasium [situated at Knowle House adjacent to 2 Skene St.]

Knowle House was listed for auction on 12.12.1893 but there is no evidence this is linked with the possible death of Mary. [The Misses Clanchy began their Central College at Knowle House, 1895.]

No evidence of Mary McCann's school has been traced beyond 1893.

Reasons for this could include:

\* the recession of the 1890s

\* the rise of free government education introduced in 1878 [nearby Flinders National School was an alternative option]

\* a number of similar private [girls'] schools eg that of Miss Ann Caroline Harris in neighbouring Elizabeth [now Roebuck] St [subsequently Morongo]

\* she was probably the only 'Miss McCann' left and may have married [unlikely], died, retired or worked in another school.

No conclusive identification of Mary McCann has been traced and no likely record of her death has been found on Victorian indexes.

Wallace Street: In 1869 William Wallace Miles was advertising in his full name his Mercer's Hill Nursery, Noble Street. Miles later was thrice mayor of Newtown and Chilwell and as his nursery was on the south side in the vicinity of Moorak Park it is probable that on subdivision his surname was given to the easternmost street whilst a family name 'Wallace' was given to the westernmost street. The Christian name William had long been taken up in the same municipality.
