Her husband's mother, the wife of Andrew Young, was also called Martha. Annie could be a daughter-in-law or niece of Ann and Robert. Also check Annie YOUNG, died 1831, Geelong aged 71 therefore b.c.1860. Daughter of Thomas LLOYD and Mary DOOLEY.

Frances also named 1903 at 121 Skene St.
